

Maintenance work, including temporary closures, on Tooleybuc Bridge over the Murray River, from Monday 27 August 2018

The NSW and Victorian governments are funding this \$350,000 essential maintenance work to strengthen the bridge.

Roads and Maritime Services will carry out the work, which involves installing temporary supports on the bridge trusses and under the bridge deck.

We will be working:

- Between 7am and 5pm, Monday to Friday, from Monday 27 August to Friday 7 September
- Between 6am and 6pm on Sunday 2 September and Sunday 9 September
- Between 10pm and 6am, Monday to Thursday nights, from Monday 10 September to Friday 28 September

We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

Due to the narrowness of the single lane bridge and the large machinery required on site, the bridge will need to be closed to all traffic for the safety of workers and road users.

The bridge will be closed between 7am and 5pm on Sunday 2 September and Sunday 9 September.

The work will involve the use of machinery which may generate some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise impacts.

The bridge will also be temporarily closed Monday to Thursday nights, between 10pm and 6am, from Monday 10 September to Friday 28 September.

During day shifts motorists may experience delays of up to five minutes.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

During bridge closures motorists will be detoured via Nyah Bridge on Speewa Road and should allow an extra 45 minutes travel time during this work.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
