Grants, scholarships and awards

<u>Conservation Partner Grants</u> to support private landholders in NSW. Offered through the Biodiversity Conservation Trust. Ongoing subject to availability.

<u>Protecting our Places</u> grants to empower Aboriginal community groups and organisations to protect, conserve and restore cultural landscapes and waterways. Closing 8 October 2018.

<u>Clubgrants Category 3</u> - for community groups and organisations to build and upgrade infrastructure. Closing 22 October 2018.

<u>Waste Less Recycle More grants</u> - for Local Aboriginal Land Councils to improve waste management of discrete Aboriginal communities. Closing 5 pm, 2 November 2018.

<u>Safe Shooting</u> grants to allow clubs and ranges to continue to upgrade facilities safely and provide opportunities for the community to participate. Closing 8 October 2018.

<u>Premier's Anzac Memorial Scholarship</u> which will give 20 high school students the chance to visit historic sites and battlegrounds in Germany, France and Belgium. Schools can submit and EOI until 10.00 am, 15 October.

<u>Start Strong Capital Works funding for preschools</u>. Closing 2 November 2018.

<u>EPA Food Donation Education Grants</u> for community organisations and local councils for projects that redirect surplus quality food from waste. Closing 8 November 2018.

Telstra Business Women's Awards. Closing 8 November 2018.

<u>Community War Memorials Fund and the Anzac Community Grants program.</u> Applications close Remembrance Day, 11 November. <u>Early Childhood education scholarships for Aboriginal people</u>. Closing 7 December 2018.

<u>Aboriginal land clean-up and prevention grants program</u> to target illegal dumping on Aboriginal land. Closing 30 September 2019 or when funding allocation exhausted.
