The red gum industry has been in the spotlight over the past week, after I put forward the Notice of Motion for my Private Member's Bill to restore access to sustainable timber harvesting in the redgum forests by returning the Murray Valley National Park to a State Forest. The Notice of Motion is the first step in this parliamentary process.

Highlights of my week in Parliament have been:

 Hosting Carrathool Mayor Peter Laird whilst meeting with Health Minister Brad Hazzard to address the doctor's shortage. It is so pleasing that Dr Maria Sewell has accepted a position at the Hillston Medical Centre with Dr Kumar.

- Meeting with Primary Industries Minister Niall Blair about Murray Valley Groundwater issues.
- Attending the HCCC Committee meeting which is undertaking the inquiry into cosmetic health service complaints in NSW (as part of my parliamentary role on this committee).
- Hosting Leeton Mayor Paul Maytom and General Manager Jackie Kruger to discuss funding options for proposed projects in the shire with the Deputy Premier's Office and Sports Minister Stuart Ayres. We also caught up with Finance Minister Victor Dominello who gave the good news that the old Water Resources building will be sold to Leeton Sire for \$1.

Today I am in Wentworth and have had great pleasure in opening Wentworth Shire Council's Small Business Expo on behalf of the Deputy Premier John Barilaro. The event is part of Small Business Month.

Over the weekend I look forward to attending the NSW SES Leeton Unit for a very important naming ceremony (more details about this in next week's issue).

Murray tradies set to save big bucks under licensing reforms
