

Stronger Country Communities Funding Success

Council is thrilled to report that Balranald has been awarded \$1.36 million under the Stronger Country Communities Funding (SCCF). Three of seven projects submitted were awarded funding this round and this is a fantastic outcome for our community.

Council would like to thank all the community members who contributed to the forums from which these applications were constructed. This is a wonderful achievement and Council looks forward to sharing future updates as these projects get underway. Scope details are as follow:

Sports Multi-Purpose Centre Renewal Project (Footy Shed—Greenham Park)

- Supply and fit 1,000 m² gyprock ceiling panelling and reframe existing trusses as necessary to remaining areas.
- Supply and install ceiling insulation throughout centre.
- Supply and installation of air conditioning/heating for main area.
- Supply and install 1,200m² vinyl flooring throughout.
- Full fit-out of kitchen and bar facilities:
- Paint walls and ceiling.

Janelle Masters Memorial Pool Revitalisation Project:

- Upgrade existing kiosk add new shelving and storage and cafe area.
- Remove existing toilets to construct a new disabled toilet, toilets and showers.
- Upgrade entrance and add new signage and render facade.
- Installation of irrigation system for lawn area.
- Extend roof over BBQ area and pave.
- Install two new steel shade shelters.

Market Streetscape Revitalisation Project – Stage Two: Mayall Street to River Street:

- Undergrounding the powerlines along Market Street from Mayall to River Street.
- Installation of new overhead street lighting.
- Upgrading pedestrian footpaths along both sides of Market Street from Mayall to River Street.
- Installation of an advanced tree line and planter areas between footpaths and kerbs
- Replacing existing street furniture, including seats, benches, bin surrounds, bollards
- Revitalisation of Theatre Royal parking area.
- Public art: Murals and sculptures

"Retracing the Journey" (Trek Rerun)

Nearly 90 people stopped over in Balranald on Wednesday 10th October, travelling from the Barossa Valley, on route to the town of Walla Walla, retracing a wagon journey taken 150 years ago. In October 1868, a group of German Lutherans left Ebenezer in South Australia to travel overland in horse drawn vehicles, to NSW to settle. They were from German families that immigrated to SA between 1838 and 1856. They travelled with 14 wagons, 2 spring carts, cows to provide milk for the children and poultry to provide eggs. Those retracing the journey are making the journey in six days, rather than the six weeks taken 150 years ago. Retracing the original route as closely as possible in their much more modern vehicles – the earliest vehicle used dates from 1953.

Changed Traffic Conditions

Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) would like to advise Swan Hill Bridge is back to normal service. Thank you for your patience during night closures to carry out essential maintenance work.

Motorists are reminded the bridge continues to operate at General Mass Limits only, which is 42.5 tonnes for semi trucks and 62.5 B doubles, with a 3.1 metre width restriction in place.
