A significant milestone is about to be reached with the bitumen sealing of the last remaining unsealed section of the Balranald–Ivanhoe Road ("the Wooltrack"). Weather permitting, the last bitumen will be sprayed on 28 June 2019, thus successfully completing an ambitious endeavour by Council to have the work completed by the end of the 2018/2019 financial year.

The project consisted of two sections totalling 10.6km in length located approximately 180km north of Balranald which required reshaping, improved drainage, pavement strengthening and bitumen sealing at a total cost of nearly \$2.8 million. The work commenced in February and was carried out using a combination of Council staff contractors working seamlessly together on rosters of nine days on and five days off. Crews camped at Claremont Station while working on site.



The newly constructed sections of road are separated by a 4km section of bitumen that will be widened and strengthened over the next couple of years, but for now road users have uninterrupted bitumen over the 228km between Balranald and Ivanhoe. This is expected to attract an increased volume of traffic heading to and from Queensland as well as providing a safer haul route for output from the mineral sands mines in the north of the Shire.

There were many challenges to be overcome in completing the project successfully in a very tight timeframe. These included communication difficulties from a combination of the distance away from base and the lack of mobile phone coverage, and the challenge of plant maintenance far from any mechanical support services. A lack of suitable pavement gravel within reasonable proximity was overcome by using a technique of stabilising the local gravel with cement to improve its strength.



Council's Director of Infrastructure and Development, Ray Davy, said that the successful completion of the project on time and within budget was a testament to the dedication of the Council crew and the contractors who worked with them, and thanked the many people who had provided support for the crew including local landowners who had cooperated with access to water, gravel pits and camping facilities.


A separate project on the Ivanhoe-Mildura Road from Clare crossroads to Arumpo has also been completed to provide safer conditions for traffic on the Wooltrack heading to and from the Mildura region. The Wooltrack project was funded by the NSW Government and Mr Davy said it was hoped that the Government could now be persuaded to take over funding responsibility for the east-west "missing link" from Mossgiel to Buronga which would now experience increasing traffic volumes with the upgrading of the Wooltrack.

Rate review means positive outcome for Balranald Shire Ratepayers

Council was required to conduct a Rate Review under the Performance Improvement Order. The new rating category structure has resulted in improved rates equalization which better reflects the use of the land. The restructure has not affected the categorisation of all ratepayers. Your annual rate notice, issued in July each year also identifies your declared rating category.

The 10% Special Rate Variation has been applied to Council's total permissible income for 2019/20. However, there has been a redistribution of rates between the categories to allow for a more fair and equitable reallocation. This may mean that your rates have varied from previous years and Council strongly recommends that you review how it may impact you. Many of the categories for General Rates still remain well under the minimum rate of \$540 as set out by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal.

Balranald Shire Council Signs Up For Energy Savings

Balranald Shire Council is one of 18 to join the Office of Environment and Heritage's (OEH) ground-breaking program to help communities save energy and cut power bills. The OEH Sustainable Councils and Communities Program is a \$1.7 million, four-year pilot program working with resource constrained councils to help them better understand their energy use, so they can make the business case for efficiency or upgrade projects.

OEH Sustainability Programs Director, Mick O'Flynn, said: "This program is funded by the NSW Government's Climate Change Fund to help councils with limited budgets become 'investment ready' for energy saving projects which previously have been beyond their reach.

"The program will also focus on cutting energy bills for households and businesses and improving the comfort of homes for the most vulnerable. Participating councils will encourage their communities to apply for programs like the Appliance Replacement Offer and discount lighting upgrades for small businesses and households."

"There's a great desire in these local government areas to be part of a sustainable future and this program will provide the support and expert advice to help turn that desire into reality" Mr O'Flynn said.

Rate review... cont.

Residential If you are a Residential ratepayer in the township of Balranald or Euston, there is no change to your categorisation. A new category has been created for Oxley Residential to reflect the location and nature of this township. New categories have been declared for Rural General 0-2 hectares, and Rural Residential land between 2 and 40 hectares in size and does not operate any substantial farming activity. This category effectively replaced the deleted category "Other Rural". If you were rated as "Other Rural", but engage in an ongoing farming activity, you will now be categorised in the appropriate farmland category.

Business In some instances some Ratepayers operating businesses on the same parcel of land as their residence were not charged the Business rate. They have now have been categorised the same as all other business operators. In general, the business category for both Euston and Balranald has decreased.

New industries which have emerged in the rural zone have brought excellent business and employment opportunities to Balranald Shire. However, the existing ratepayers should not be subsidising the additional cost to maintain Council's infrastructure and facilities in the town. As a result, there was a need to categorise these industries separately from neighbouring General Farmland.

Farmland As well as emerging businesses, Balranald Shire has seen the development of farmland for more intensive agricultural industries. Intensive farmland is generally identified by a large scale production of agricultural produce, labour intensive, and/or intensive land use supported by supplementary irrigation. The Shire has continued to see development of wine and table grapes and is also experiencing development of large scale orchards, including almonds and pistachios. These industries have a greater impact on Council's infrastructure compared to surrounding general dryland farming, which includes dryland cropping and grazing. Council has created a new category for Intensive Irrigable Horticulture and has levied a more equitable rate for Intensive Farmland.

Mining Council is provided with a value of a Mining Licence by the Valuer General for rating purposes. The value given takes into account the value of the resource and its ability to be extracted. Like the other new emerging industries, mining activities have a significant impact on Council's road infrastructure. Rates are levied accordingly.

Pedestal charge on Commercial properties Council, in the previous 2018/19 budget, approved the implementation of pedestal charges on all commercial properties where there are more than two cisterns and/ or urinals. This charge will contribute towards the additional load on the sewer network and cost of maintaining and upgrading the network.

Additional Water & Sewer Connections on Residential properties This charge will impact residential units, flats and accommodation facilities as they impose a greater demand on Council's water and sewer network. Each additional unit/flat or residence on a single assessment will incur an additional 50% of the base connection size access charge for both water and sewer.

Stormwater Levy The stormwater levy guidelines were introduced in 2006 by the Office of Local Government in conjunction with other relevant authorities. The purpose of the levy is to manage the quantity and quality of stormwater that flows off land and manage the re-use of stormwater for any purpose. Funds raised from the levy will be utilised for projects including the improvement of street drainage. The 2019/20 financial year will be the first year this levy will be charged. Land within the urban area that is rated as Residential or Business, except for vacant land, will incur the levy. Council has proposed to charge the minimum charge of \$25 per assessment.

Notice to Ratepayers: Overdue Rates and Water Charges

The 4th instalment of rates and water charges were due 31 May 2019. If you have not paid your rates and charges in full, please contact the Rates Officer to arrange a payment plan. If you pay by regular bank deposits, please ensure you are paying enough to cover the amount due. If you receive an overdue notice you need to contact Council as soon as possible to avoid legal charges. Please note that overdue accounts attract 7.5 % pa interest.





Changed Traffic Conditions

Roads and Maritime Services advise of changed traffic conditions Swan Hill on Bridge for essential maintenance work.

The bridge will be temporarily closed Monday to Thursday nights, between 11pm and 6am from Monday 29 April to the end of August 2019. The work involves strengthening the bridge structure to remove the current width restriction.

Motorists will be detoured via Nyah Bridge on the Speewa Road.

Heavy vehicle restrictions will apply throughout the work to protect Swan Hill Bridge from heavy loads. The bridge will be restricted to semitrailers at 42.5 tonnes, with B-doubles prohibited. The 24hour detour for B-doubles is via Tooleybuc Bridge. Please refer to NSW heavy vehicle maps.

Sensors & cameras will monitor the bridge's load capacity and heavy vehicle inspectors will have an increased presence in the area to monitor compliance. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
