BALRANALD SOUTHERN BELL FROG PLAY-SCULPTURE LAUNCH

On 30 November 2020 students from local schools along with a host of delegates and locals, congregated at the newly revitalized Senior Citizen's Plaza to celebrate the launch of Balranald's new giant southern bell frog play-sculpture: Swampy.

The play-sculpture is a unique art piece made of stainless steel standing five metres long and two metres high. It is designed and constructed by Artist Xavier Pinnard from Yackandandah. "I'm very pleased that the Balranald community has given me the opportunity to create something unique and fun for their CBD" Mr Pinnard said.

Late last year, local children were given the opportunity to participate in a colouring in and naming competition about the play-sculpture. Assessed by a panel of locals, ten year old, Archie Alderuccio from St Joseph's Parish Primary School won best colouring-in; eight year old Jyziah Wilson from Balranald Central School won the naming rights – and so the play-sculpture is now affectionately known as Swampy, the Southern Bell Frog. Both the winners and their classes attended the launch.

"The Plaza is now a fun, safe place for youth to hang out" said Youth Mayor Jackson Bialobrzeski who was also one of the panelists who assessed the colouring in and naming competition.

Mr Lindsay-Field, Chair of Council's Growing Business, Industry and Tourism Advisory Committee, spoke to the crowd of onlookers about the significance of the event. He sees the launch as marking a coming-of-age for Balranald's local economy and tourism branding. "Word is really starting to spread on the quality and diversity of Balranald's offerings for locals and visitors and it shows with the increased number of visitors we're now seeing – it's truly remarkable" he said.



INFRASTRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The first stage reconstruction of **Marma-Box Creek Road** to extend the bitumen seal has now been completed with a further 15km of seal placed. A further extension will be carried out in early 2021.

Reconstruction of a badly damaged section of the **Wooranbara – Corrong Road** has been completed. Funding submissions have been submitted for the reconstruction of **Benanee Road** and the widening of **Leslie Drive** under Round 2 of the Fixing Local Roads programme.





Contract maintenance grading has been completed on the **Euston to Marma Road**, the **Prungle Mail Road**, **Tammit** and **Gulthul Roads** and a section of the **Clare-Freshwater Road**. Due to budget constraints, further maintenance grading work will now be confined to dealing with safety issues for the balance of the financial year.

Funding under Round 1 of the **Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Programme** was confirmed at the November Ordinary Council Meeting for the following projects:

Bidgee Haven Hostel tenders for the new high dependency wing closed on 27 November 2020, with five tenders received. These are currently undergoing technical evaluation prior to a formal evaluation process leading to the selection of a preferred tenderer and a recommendation to Council for options relating to the award of a contract.







Increasing Resilience to Climate Change (IRCC) Project Progress Report

Council has submitted the Progress Report for Phases II of the NSW Government funded *Climate Change Adaptive Private Domestic Water Supplies on Rural and Remote Properties* project. Although Covid 19 has imposed considerable constraints on activities the questionnaire survey has been successfully undertaken, Environmental and Social Baselines have been documented, and information sheets prepared and disseminated.

Key points from the survey are:

- 201 rural properties were identified in the Shire with 162 having discreet occupancy
- 106 properties with contact details were identified and all have been phoned
- 45 surveys have been submitted accounting for 42% response rate and if all properties are included this is a 21% response rate

This survey seeks information that will assist rural householders in ensuring that their domestic water supplies are adequate and safe.

As part of the IRCC Project Communications Strategy Council has released two information sheets.

- Information Sheet 01: How safe are your household water supplies?
- Information Sheet 02: Who is responsible for ensuring that private household water supplies are secure and safe?

And the following will be released in the coming months.

- Information Sheet 03: Changing climatic conditions
- · Information Sheet 04: Do-it-yourself water quality testing
- Information Sheet 05: Managing your household water storage
- Information Sheet 06: Best practice for rainwater tanks
- · Information Sheet 07: Optimising household water supplies
- Information Sheet 08: Drought proofing: Anticipating a 'Water Crisis' and planning for 'Day Zero'

'Do-it-yourself' water quality testing of rural household supplies and rainwater tanks in towns is planned for March 2021.


BE COVID AWARE
