In May 2020, after being placed in Administration, Balranald Shire Council commenced a process of reviewing their existing Advisory Committee structure. Leadership at Balranald Shire Council realised that, without Councillors and a renewed Advisory Committee framework, it may be difficult for some community members to have their concerns and hopes heard. As a result, seven Advisory Committees were formed. The Strengthening Community Access, Inclusion & Wellbeing (SCAIW) Advisory Committee is one.






The SCAIW Advisory Committee formed and started meeting monthly from October 2020. Our committed and passionate members include: Sue Balshaw, Lyn Flanagan, Mandy Haley, Jedda Kelly, Lea Lawrie, Natalie Lay, Emma Moore, Helen Murphy, Michelle White and Rachael Williams.





Already we have made some early achievements including:

- Commencing the research and development of a local and visiting health and wellbeing services' directory for our area and identifying service 'gaps' so we can advocate for unmet needs,
- Providing visiting services with a 'touch-point' in the Shire. To increase our knowledge each SCAIW meeting starts with a guest speaker from a local or visiting service. We are also supporting services with requests for 'local knowledge' including our understanding of service gaps, the recruitment of positions locally and how best to connect with our communities,



 Advising council on all areas relating to Access, Inclusion & Wellbeing, including providing support with the Disability Inclusion Action Plan which is scheduled for review.







A Terms of Reference guides how we work, we must:

- Function predominantly with a primary health network responsibility.
- Map and monitor provision of health, well-being and connection/inclusion services and programs.
- Plan and advocate regarding closing service gaps and improving public access and amenity for all.
- Support and promote community knowledge of, and access to, all available services.
- Identify and promote inclusion of community diversity and events and programs which celebrate diversity.

INFRASTRUCTURE REPORT

Road construction and maintenance

Contractors are well advanced on the widening of the Kyalite-Moulamein Road from the Kyalite Caravan Park to the Shire boundary, with the road expected to be sealed in the week of 12 July 2021. The recently completed widening and reconstruction of 2km of the Oxley Road will also be sealed at that time.

Bitumen sealing of a reconstructed 2.7km section of Marma-Box Creek Road was carried out as scheduled in late May. A further extension of the bitumen pavement, subject to the balance of

funding available, will be undertaken later in the year.

Construction is well under way by Council's construction crew on the reconstruction and sealing of approximately 13km of the Weimby-Kyalite Road from the existing sea to Junction Park Station.

In Balranald, drainage improvements and sealing of Purton Lane in Balranald has been completed and drainage improvements in Sydney Street Balranald are under way.



In Euston, work has commenced on the installation of traffic calming thresholds in Bertram and Taylor Roads, and planning is in hand for upgrading of Kilpatrick Road and Leslie Drive in Euston.

The approaches to 12 grids on Marma Box Creek Road and D Block Road have recently been sealed to reduce future maintenance. Eighteen new double grids have been installed to replace damaged single grids, mainly on the Mildura-Ivanhoe Road and the Oxley-Clare Road.

A contract has been awarded for safety improvements (line marking and reflective pavement markers) to the 100km of MR67 from Hatfield to the Shire boundary, in preparation for the road to be used for haulage of mineral sands concentrate from the Atlas-Campaspe mine to the proposed railhead at Ivanhoe.

Water, sewerage and drainage

An "Options Paper" has been prepared by Public Works Advisory as part of Council's Integrated Water Cycle Management (IWCM) Plan which will guide future investment in water and sewer infrastructure. The paper identified significant future risks to the ability of Council's water and sewer infrastructure to cope with projected growth in both Balranald and Euston.

Contracts have been awarded for various switchboard upgrades to improve the reliability of Council's water and sewer systems

<u>Work is complete on the latest round of sewer relining in Balranald.</u> Work on the current round of AC water mains replacement is complete in Euston and under way in Balranald.

Council continues to investigate the viability of consolidation and upgrading of the water supply to Kyalite village.

INFRASTRUCTURE REPORT CONT'D

Buildings and Facilities

A contract has been awarded for construction of new football change rooms at Greenham Park. Orders have been placed for new furniture for Greenham Park Hall. A container has been installed on site as a secure storage facility. A new disabled toilet has been installed.

A contract has been awarded for the upgrading of the Balranald tennis courts to sandfilled artificial turf. Lighting of the courts is currently being investigated.

A design team, led by C4 Architects of Adelaide, has been appointed for the design and documentation of the proposed upgrading of the Visitor Information Centre/Discovery Centre.

Work is nearing completion on the upgrade to heating in the Theatre Royal. Funds have been allocated for a conservation plan and some upgrading of underutilised spaces in the building.

Ground penetrating radar (GPR) investigation of the site of a proposed toilet at Balranald Cemetery has been completed, to ensure that no unmarked graves will be disturbed. Fencing and the installation of a new toilet at Anzac Park Balranald is under way.

A contract has been awarded for the design and construction of the Balranald Creative Learning Centre adjacent to the Art Gallery.

Open spaces

Conversion of streetlights to LED will be carried out by Essential Energy as a town-wide project in July-August.

A contract has been awarded for an additional 1.9km loop of the ecotrail walkway. Planning is in hand for modifications to the existing swing bridge the southern approach to improve accessibility.

A contract has been awarded to improve the walking tracks in Euston to improve accessibility. Enhancement of signage, seating etc. on the Robinvale Weir Ecotrail has been identified for installation in 2021-22. A "walkover" of the Euston-Robinvale walking track with Year 5-6 pupils from Euston Primary School, arranged by the Petaurus Education Group, produced a number of suggestions by the group.

Improvements to the Ben Scott Memorial Bird Walk including repairs to the concrete and timber boardwalks have been completed. Signs have been received but are still to be erected.

A path and steps linking Kyalite Anzac Park to the Riverfront Reserve will be constructed shortly. A parking area adjacent to Anzac Park is being investigated, with preliminary works for the access being carried out by the contractors engaged for adjacent road project.
