Loads declared as green waste will be inspected to ensure they are not contaminated and do not contain any other waste.

Only waste from within Balranald Shire may be deposited at Balranald and Euston Landfill Sites.

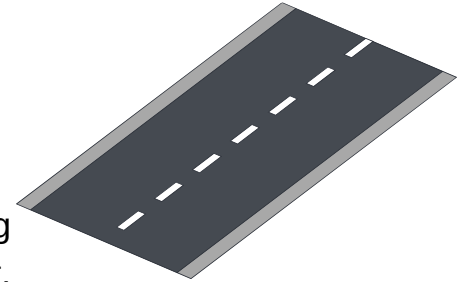
Road Construction and Maintenance

Maintenance Grading

The Graders have been out and about doing maintenance grading while we have natural moisture in the roads to assist with compaction. Resources will be focused on our school bus routes and general road safety within the coming months. Due to heavy rainfall it has been difficult to make a start on several roads. Road formation and drainage improvements will be a priority in each area, improving our area's access and general road conditions, but - as the saying goes - Rome wasn't built in a day.

Marma Box Creek Road & Tapalin Mail Road

Construction works are continuing, but once again, the rains have significantly slowed progress. While the rain is good for our farming community, our roads will have to take a back seat for the moment.



Buildings and Facilities

CWA Building

A new air-conditioner & replacement lighting have been installed in the CWA building.

Balranald Football Club

Two 4-metre sections of tiered seating have been purchased. They are located in the sheltered area under the veranda of the new change rooms.



Balranald Theatre Royal

Repairs have been completed to water damaged sections of floor. The concrete subfloor has been waterproofed and linoleum replaced with tiles to try and prevent this recurring problem in the future.

Kyalite Steps

A concrete stairway has been constructed between Kyalite ANZAC Memorial Park and the riverfront, close to the boat ramp. A steel handrail will be added in the near future. Plans are underway to add solar lighting to the stairway and an information signage board in the park.



Council would like to thank the members of the Kyalite Progressive Committee for all their hard work in arranging the works, and for their time and labour assisting with the works.

Balranald Riverfront

New, recycled plastic bollards have been installed along the Balranald riverfront, replacing the old, broken wooden rails.



Trees

Council staff has been carrying out tree trimming and removal in and around Balranald. Some trees were damaged by white ants or rot, while others have just become too large and were causing damage to infrastructure.

Council teams have been very active carrying out general maintenance to beautifying the townships and are doing a splendid job.

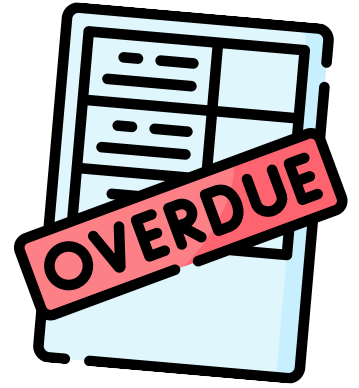

RATES

Overdue Rates and Water Bills - Reminder Notices have been sent. Please pay any outstanding amounts before June 30 to avoid a debt collection commencing and associated legal charges added to your account. If you are having problems paying please phone Council on 5020 1300 or email council@balranald.nsw.gov.au



Pensioners – do you receive a Centrelink pension or Department of Veteran Affairs pension? You may be able to receive a rebate off your rates. Inquire at the Council office or phone the Rates officer Janelle Dalton to discuss further.

Do you have a rental property? We are now able to send the water notices to the tenant (we can also send you a copy) please email advising your name, the property address, the tenants name and postal address.



Emails - we are now able to send your rates notices and water bills by email. please send your name, property details and email address to council@balranald.nsw.gov.au

Garbage Collection – Residential properties are provided with one 240 litre red-lid wheelie bin, which is collected weekly (Balranald – Monday; Euston – Friday). The cost of this service for 2022/23 will be \$390.00/pa. You may request an additional bin and collection service for the reduced amount of \$275.00p/a.



Please note: if you put out an additional non-Council bin (eg purchased from a hardware store) this will be deemed as your request for an additional bin service, and you will also be charged the additional annual bin collection fee.

Council staff regularly monitor who are putting out additional bins. Also if it is noted that you are putting out an additional Council bin which is not assigned to your property, Council may collect the additional bin.

STREET SWEEPER

Balranald:

7 July– South of Market Street (Riverside). Includes Market Street & Caravan Park.

28 July – North of Market Street (Racecourse side). Includes Market Street.

18 August - South of Market Street (River side). Includes Market Street & Caravan Park.

Euston:

13 July – Whole town of Euston.

10 August - Whole town of Euston

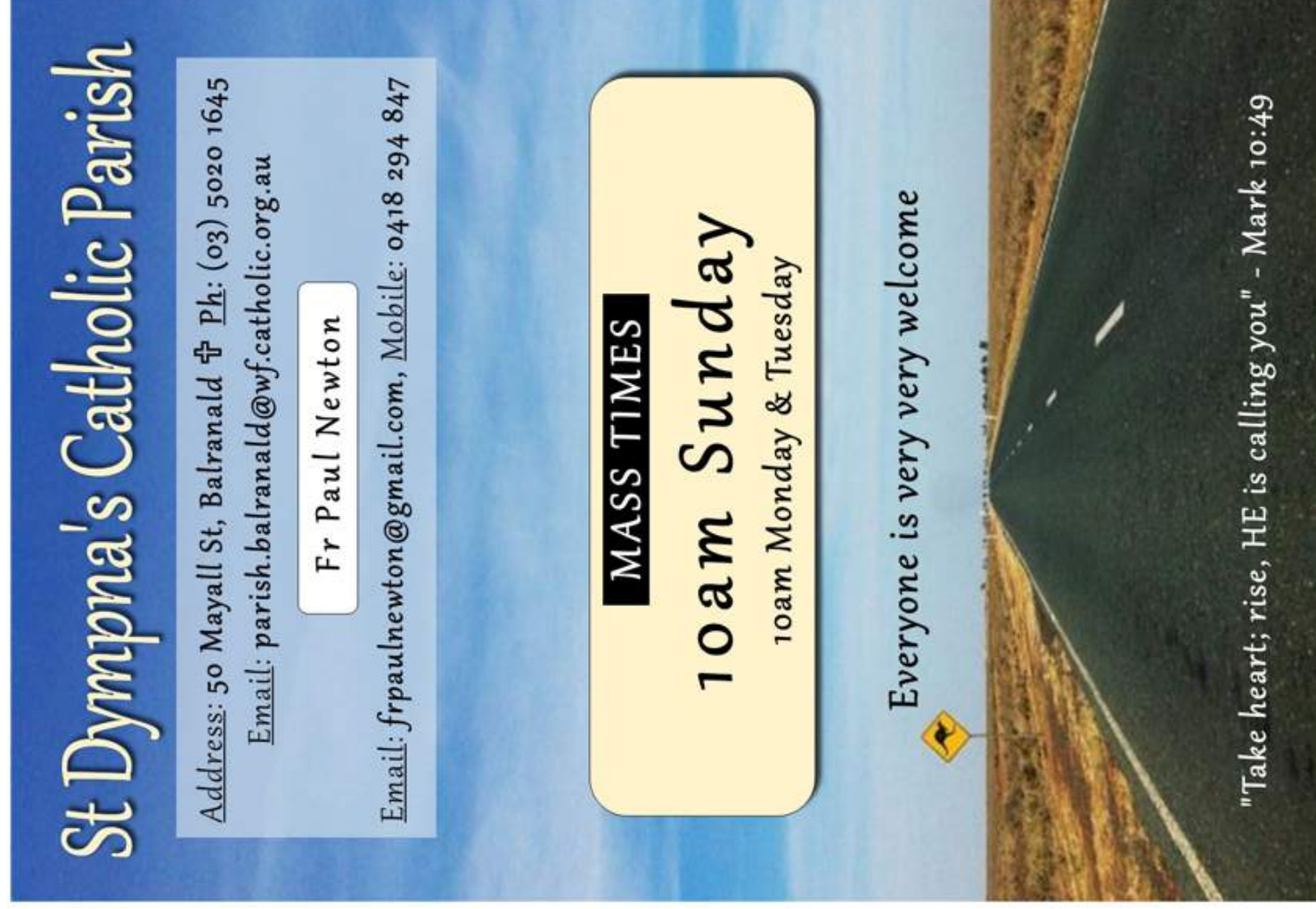
