Flood Watch for South West Catchments

Lachlan, Belubula, Tumut, Mitta Mitta and Upper Murray Rivers

Issued: Friday 19 August 2022 03.30pm



What is happening:

FLOODING POSSIBLE IN THE NEW SOUTH WALES SOUTH WEST CATCHMENTS FROM LATE FRIDAY

FLOOD WARNINGS CURRENT FOR SEVERAL NEW SOUTH WALES INLAND CATCHMENTS

Rainfall has been observed in the South West New South Wales since Thursday evening. Further rainfall is forecast for the remainder of Friday into Saturday and early next week, which may cause renewed minor flooding along rivers in the South West catchments from late Friday into early next week, many of which are experiencing ongoing flooding due to previous rainfall in recent weeks.

Catchments are currently wet or saturated from rainfall in recent weeks.

The weather system may cause renewed flooding for the following catchments listed from late Friday. Flood Classes (minor, moderate, major) are only defined for catchments where the Bureau provides a flood warning service.

Catchments likely to be affected include:

- Lachlan River to Cotton's Weir - minor flooding
- Belubula River – minor flooding
- Tumut River – minor flooding
- Upper Murray and Mitta Mitta Rivers – Minor Flooding

Flood Warnings are current for the following catchments:

Lachlan, Murrumbidgee and Murray.

What you need to do:

This Flood Watch means that people living or working along rivers and stream must monitor the latest weather forecasts and warnings and be ready to move to higher ground should flooding

People in areas likely to be impacted by flooding should prepare for increasing flood effects. All campers and caravans relocate away from the sites next to water courses.

Actions that you can take to safeguard your family, pets, and livestock include:

- Avoid storm drains and pipes, ditches, ravines and rivers.
- Never drive, walk, ride through, play or swim in floodwater—it is dangerous and toxic. If it's flooded, forget it.

Farmers and businesses are encouraged to:

- Move pumps, animals, and equipment to higher ground before roads close and organise for sufficient stock feed and water for your animals.
- Move poisons, waste and chemicals to high storage locations.
- Gather important business documents and records and keep them with you.
