In 1944, Norma Male was appointed as Town Clerk for Balranald Municipal Council; she was the first woman to hold the office of Town Clerk in a NSW council. Miss Male has had a long and distinguished career in Local Government with many achievements accredited to her. Norma celebrated her 100th Birthday on 13 January 2016. The Council established the Norma Male award in 2019, to recognise the employee considered to have made an outstanding contribution during the year. Anna commenced with Balranald Shire on 17/03/2011 as a Care Service Employee at Bidgee Haven Retirement Hostel.

Anna studied Aged Care and on 20 June 2013 received her Certificate in Aged Care.

Anna resigned from the Hostel on 2 June 2015. She was re-employed on 4 February 2017 as a PCA, although she ended up being the regular cook for our residents.

Anna was successful in her application as Receptionist/Reservations Assistant at the Caravan Park. She commenced this position on 5 August 2020 2 days per week whilst still continuing to cook at the Hostel on a casual basis.

Anna in recent times has become the Caretaker of the Balranald Shire Caravan Park (at first to fill in when the Caretakers resigned in 2011) However as she is doing such a fantastic job this has now become a more permanent arrangement.

Draft Council Policy – Public Gates and Stock Grids

Balranald Shire Council is inviting public submissions concerning the Draft Public Gates and Stock Grids policy which will impact on all landowners who have installed Public Gates or Stock Grids on roads within the shire.

The new policy complies with the requirements of the Roads Act, which states that a road authority may permit landowners through which an unfenced road passes, to install a stock grid on the boundary of any land. Under the legislation the ownership and responsibility for maintenance of the stock grid remains with the landowner. The new draft policy provides for a process to manage, replace, approve and remove public gates and stock grids on roads in compliance with the legislation. As there are currently over 272 stock grids on roads within the Shire there are significant implications for landowners who have unfenced roads through their property and this policy seeks to bring the current policies and practices into line with the legislative requirements. Balranald Council Delivers a Financially Sound Result

The Balranald Shire Council has reported a positive operating result of \$1.7m for the year ended 30th June 2022 and has set aside over \$1.8m for the replacement and upgrades to plant and equipment to deliver road and works upgrades for the community.

In referring the draft Annual Statements for audit, the Administrator Mike Colreavy praised the efforts of the staff and contractors engaged to complete the Statements, which not only indicated a good result, but were ready for audit well ahead on past years.

"I will be reporting to the Office of Local Government that Council has made significant progress on addressing the perilous financial position that existed in the past and this result signifies a turning point on delivering a sound financial basis for the future." He said.

The council has set aside cash reserves of just over \$1.5m for future Infrastructure development and an additional \$400k for improvements at the caravan park as well as significant funding for future upgrades to water, sewerage and waste facilities.

"It has been a tough few years, sorting out the problems of the past and I thank the staff and the community for their perseverance. Having the end of year result available much earlier than in the past, will enable the Council to focus on backlogs and delivering more on community expectations." Mike said.



Section 7.12 Development Contribution Plan

Council has created a draft Development Contributions Plan, which will be open for public exhibition on Council's website until 28 October 2022. The Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979 permits Council to establish this plan •The Plan aims to require contributions from developers undertaking works valued at over \$100,000 within the local government area. •The value of contributions will be:

Cost of Development & Contribution Levy Rate %

All development valued at \$100,000 or less 0.0 %

All development valued at \$100,001 to \$200,000 0.5 %

All development valued in excess of \$200,000 1.0%

•The plan also seeks to recover contributions for significant projects that are located outside the local government area but have potential impacts on our communities. (e.g. solar farms and wind farms.)

•Contributions for development outside the local government area will likely be negotiated via the State Significant Development process, with this Contribution Plan being the basis of negotiation.

 In general terms single residential development, including outbuildings such as sheds/carports/pergolas will be exempt from paying contributions under this Plan.

•There is provision in the plan to make in kind contributions or seek exemption from the need to pay a contribution based on the merits of the proposal.

Contributions will be allocated to public facilities and services identified by community consultation and listed in the Work Schedule of the Plan. Important note: the items listed in the draft schedule are examples only and will be adjusted following the public consultation process.

It is important that the schedule of public facilities and services to be funded by contributions reflect the community's vision. council is keen to receive submissions in relation to the plan. along with suggestions on amenities and services that should be included in the work schedule of the plan.

Infrastructure Report

Road Construction and Maintenance

Kerb and gutter works have commenced in Church Street, Balranald to improve drainage and reduce standing water after rain. Works are expected to be completed by the end of September, weather permitting.

Buildings & Facilities

Balranald Swimming Pool

All three pools have been pumped out and cleaned. Minor repairs will be carried out prior to repainting ready for the summer season.

Theatre Royal

The Theatre Royal row of buildings was subject to smoke and water damage after the fire which occurred on 7 August 2022. Insurance assessments have been carried out and repairs commenced on 12 September 2022. The repairs include removal and replacement of damaged ceiling portions, light fittings and carpets, and repainting of damaged areas.

The Can Assist book shop is currently located in the Theatre Royal "ticketing office" until repairs to the usual shop location have been completed.

<u>Balranald Tip</u>

Council will take over operations at the Balranald Tip on 1st October. A staff position has been created at Council for a Waste Facility Operator and this position has been advertised. Meanwhile the operation of the tip will be undertaken by current Council staff.

Council is in the process of sourcing suitable machinery for operations at the Waste Facility. As there is no public weighbridge service available in Balranald, Council is investigating the viability of installing a weighbridge at the Balranald Waste Facility in the future.

Kerbside Pick Up

Council has received inquiries concerning the annual council hard rubbish collection and can advise that Council will not be having a hard rubbish collection in October.

October is the time when annual events begin and tourist are visiting our area. The collection of hard rubbish on the footpath is not an image that Council and the community would be wanting to promote. The wet weather is also likely to impact on this service.

Accordingly, it is proposed to defer the hard rubbish collection till later in the year or early in the new year and that date and time will be advertised. In the meantime, it is proposed to have a number of fee free weekends at the tip for domestic waste, including hard waste and these events will also be promoted as an opportunity for friends & neighbour to get together and help with clean-up.

Please remember there is no charge for green waste at Council's tips.



The SCAIW Advisory Committee formed in 2020 as one of the seven Advisory Committees created through the Shire's renewed efforts to hear and respond to community voice after coming under Administration.

The aim of the SCAIW Advisory Committee is to improve well-being, inclusion and access outcomes across the entire Shire area. However, at the moment our membership is largely Balranald based, so we are looking to broaden our team of volunteers to ensure we have involvement from across the Shire.

Since we formed in late 2020 we have worked to create a Shire wide services directory, hold service provider networking events, advocate for increased service provision, create a Shire level Community Health Profile, support awareness raising around family violence and the provision of emergency housing within the Shire and most recently gain funding to deliver Mental Health First Aid training across the LGA.

We meet on the 4th Thursday of each month from 4-5:30pm. Meetings are in person with the option to join via Zoom so there is no expectation that member's travel.

If you are interested in becoming a member you need to complete the Balranald Shire Council's Advisory Committee Registration form. Your registration form then goes to a Council meeting for approval by the Administrator and General Manager.
