



## Wakool Junction, Boundary Bend and surrounds flooding

### Prepare to isolate

### Watch and Act

The NSW SES advises people in the following area(s) to **PREPARE TO ISOLATE** due to predictions that the Wakool River and Murray River are experiencing high flows with major flooding:

- Wakool Junction and surrounds
- Boundary Bend and surrounds
- All properties along the Wakool River

You should monitor the situation and prepare to be isolated by floodwater. Consider the effects isolation will have on family, work, and educational commitments.

You may be trapped without power, water, and other essential services and it may be too dangerous for NSW SES to rescue you.

### What are we expecting?

The Bureau of Meteorology advises the Murray River at Wakool Junction peaked at 11.73 metres on Sunday 13 November and is currently at 11.71 metres and steady, with major flooding.

The Murray River at Boundary Bend is likely to peak near 9.05 metres around Friday, with major flooding than the 1975 flood event.

Based on predictions from the Bureau of Meteorology, the following areas may be impacted by flooding:

- Roads and bridges
- Low-lying areas

### What you need to do:

- Dam information: <https://www.watarnsw.com.au/>
- If you have a Home and/or Business Emergency Plan, use it now. Otherwise, have a conversation and plan for what you will do and take with you if you need to evacuate.
- Be prepared - you may be isolated for an extended period of time. Make sure you have essential supplies prepared to last for at least three to five days, including food, drinking water, medications, pet food, and animal feed.
- Be prepared - you may lose services including power, communications, water, sewerage, and gas. Relocate waste containers, chemicals, and poisons well above the flood level.
- Companion animals and livestock should be relocated to higher ground that will not become an island.
- Monitor the situation closely for updates on rain and river conditions.
- Share this information with family, friends, and neighbours, and help others prepare for isolation where possible.

- If you are isolated and require resupply, contact NSW SES on 132 500.
- Flood-affected landholders can request assistance through the Agricultural and Animal Services Hotline, by calling 1800 814 647 (operating 7 days, 8am to 6pm).
