Great Murray River Salami Festival

Salami Festival was again held in Euston on Saturday 13 November 2022. Although the weather wasn't the best the rain held off for most of the day with only a couple of light showers.

The weekend festivities commenced on Friday evening with a mee4t and greet of our 10 Salami judges, which was hosted on the Station 46 Deck of Euston Club Resort from 6-8pm.

Saturday morning commenced with the Salami competition judging, commencing at 8am and with 57 entries received gave the judges some tough decision. Judging was over by 10.30am and winners were announced. The festival was moved to Euston Recreation Reserve due to the Riverfront being flooded, commenced at 10am and went through the day until 4pm. The moving of this function did not stop the hive of activities, there was lots of music, food vans, market stalls and children's activities and enjoyed by all.
