Draft Council Policy – Public Gates and Stock Grids

Balranald Shire Council is inviting public submissions concerning the Draft Public Gates and Stock Grids policy which will impact on all landowners who have installed Public Gates or Stock Grids on roads within the shire.

The new policy complies with the requirements of the Roads Act, which states that a road authority may permit landowners through which an unfenced road passes, to install a stock grid on the boundary of any land. Under the legislation the ownership and responsibility for maintenance of the stock grid remains with the landowner.

The new draft policy provides for a process to manage, replace, approve and remove public gates and stock grids on roads in compliance with the legislation.

As there are currently over 272 stock grids on roads within the Shire there are significant implications for landowners who have unfenced roads through their property and this policy seeks to bring the current policies and practices into line with the legislative requirements.

Infrastructure Report

Road Construction and Maintenance

Contractors have been engaged to carry out road reformation and compaction on:

- Benanee Road
- Mildura Ivanhoe Road

Once these works are completed, contractors will commence works on:

- Prungle Marma Road
- Marma Box Creek Road
- Turlee Leaghur Road
- Oxley Clare Road
- Tarwong Freshwater Road
- Clare Freshwater Road

All of these works are weather dependant.

Kerb and Gutter works in Church Street, Balranald (designed to improve drainage and reduce standing water after rain) have been delayed by persistent wet weather. The works are now expected to be completed by mid-November, weather permitting.

Buildings & Facilities

Balranald Library and C.W.A. Building

Exciting developments are underway at Balranald Library. New library officer, Janaya Gaston, has been successful in obtaining government grants to renovate and redevelop the library and C.W.A. building and create facilities for a wider range of people within the community.

The library reception desk has been moved further away from the entrance door, creating an area which will be transformed into a small children's play area. New glass double doors open from this area onto the playground. Once the outside paving has been upgraded, this entrance will be wheelchair accessible.

A new window has been installed in the reception area to provide better visibility of the playground.

New internal double doors have been installed to connect the library and C.W.A. buildings. The unused C.W.A. room will be fitted out as a Technology Hub.

New mural paintings have been added to the external library wall.

Further works are ongoing and are planned to be completed by January 2023.

Further grant funding is being sought to transform the library park with new sand and water play areas and good shade.



TOURISM UPDATE



After the challenges of Covid and the ups and down of visitor numbers, it has been wonderful to have steady stream of visitors and travellers back to the shire with increased activity and buzz at the Visitor Information Centre and with our marketing activities.

- Since January this year to the end of September we have welcomed close to 11,400 visitors at the Visitor Information Centre and from visitor numbers recorded in January to the figures recorded at the end of September, visitor numbers had increased by 95%.
- During the period of January to end of September we also increased our social media promotional posts and stories highlighting all the wonderful things to see and do in our fabulous shire. We created geographical target audiences behind our social media promotions and used high resolution images and appealing content to optimise audience reach and engagement.
- Between January and end of September our promotional Facebook posts reached a total audience of 710,840 and 76,824 people engaged directly with our posts (liked, commented, shared our posts)

Activity Highlights between January and end of September 2022 included:

- · Hosting a number of regional Destination Planning workshops
- Hosting the Regional Economic Development Strategy workshop with regional stakeholders
- Staging the "Shop in Balranald Shire" Christmas campaign
- Staging and hosting the Small Business Dinner Event & implementing the Easter Marketing Campaign
- Staging the Easter Egg Hunt and Easter Twilight Market events
- The Discovery Centre precinct being selected as part of Tourism Australia's National Experience Content Initiative. Filming and photography shoot took place at the Discovery Centre and surrounds which will produce high end footage and photos that will be published on Tourism Australia's image and video galleries and for our own marketing activities
- Succeeding in winning 5 tourism/events related grants
- Commencing the development of a new tourism website (due to be launched in late November 2022)
- Implementing the production of a Small Business Video which promotes all our visitor service business across the shire being accommodation venues, retailers, eateries, vehicle services etc. The video is scheduled to be released with the launch of the new website and a new YouTube video channel in late November 2022.
- Full Page Advertising and Editorial in 2 editions of Caravanning Australia
- Releasing monthly event calendars and supported various community events


