NEW LAWS FOR LOCAL FOOD BUSINESSES

Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices.

While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors.

The NSW Food Authority has developed a range of resources to help businesses prepare for the new Standard, including free online food handler training.

Businesses can also do a quick quiz to check if the requirements apply.

DOMESTIC FIREWOOD PERMITS YANGA NATIONAL PARK

Permits are available from 1 April until 30 September 2023 for domestic firewood collection on Yanga National Park. The available firewood is from a single collection point and consists of redgum milled timber offcuts (sleeper backs).

Permits cost \$25/tonne or \$12.50/tonne for pensioner concession with a limit of 6 tonnes per household per year.

Permits are only available to residents of Balranald and Murray River Shires.

GARBAGE BINS



PLEASE CLOSE THE LID

Overflowing rubbish bins lead to escaping rubbish and more litter on our streets

Exposed rubbish attracts scavengers and vermin

PLEASE DO NOT OVERFILL YOUR BIN - MAKE SURE THAT THE LID IS FULLY CLOSED

COUNCIL CAN SUPPLY AN ADDITIONAL BIN FOR YOUR HOME FOR \$300 PER YEAR - THAT'S ONLY \$5.77 PER WEEK (Extra bins put out that do not have the Council logo will NOT be emptied on collection day)

The garbage truck begins collections very early in the morning. If your bin is not put out THE NIGHT BEFORE, you may miss out on your bin being emptied. The truck is fitted with cameras that record each bin it passes.

The garbage truck will NOT return to empty your bin if it is not put out in time

Putting old oil, or liquid paint into the garbage, even in a sealed container can cause:

- Garbage truck fires
- Toxic land pollution
- Spray onto nearby property if the truck compressors burst the container













There is a Community Recycling Station in the foyer of Balranald Council offices and at Balranald Library for old, unbroken fluoro light globes, smoke detectors, mobile phones and household batteries to be recycled safely.




PLEASE DON'T THROW BATTERIES IN THE BIN

Chances are, every battery you've ever used is sitting in landfill, leaking toxic materials into the environment, and wasting Earth's precious resources.

- Batteries in bins can spark or explode causing fires
- Batteries in landfill can leak toxic waste, which can pollute the ground and water
- Batteries contain rare elements, such as cobalt & manganese, which can be recycled.









Put them in a glass container and keep out of reach of children

Take them to a drop off centre and take your container home.
