BALRANALD SWIMMING POOL OPEN FOR SUMMER

The Janelle Masters Memorial Swimming Pool in Balranald re-opened for the summer season on 28 October 2023.

The pool will open at the advertised times when the weather forecast predicts temperatures of 26 degrees and above. On very hot days, the pool may remain open longer, subject to staff discretion and availability.

The old perimeter fence around the swimming pool complex did not meet current standards and has been replaced. The new fence is compliant with the latest NSW Swimming Pool Regulations. The cost of the new fence was met by Government grant funding.

A DAY FOR SERVICES AND COMMUNITY

On Thursday 19th October 2023, local and visiting services and community members came together at Balranald's Theatre Royal for a day of learning and networking.

The Health, Wellbeing & Support Services Networking Expo was planned and delivered by Maari Ma Health with support from Balranald Shire Council's Strengthening Community Access, Inclusion & Wellbeing Advisory Committee (SCAIWAC).

In total 24 organisations - both local to Balranald and visiting - showcased a comprehensive range of services and supports to our community. More than 100 community members and agencies, including students from St Joseph's Primary School, attended the Expo which ran from 11am to 3pm. Attendees enjoyed free advice, resources and lunch as they browsed through the range of exhibitors.

Aimed to coincide with GambleAware week - a focus of the event was on raising awareness of the damage caused by gambling. Both MaariMa and the SCAIWAC have received funding from the Office of Responsible Gambling to undertake programs over the next three years to reduce the harm to individuals, families and communities caused by gambling.

The event was made possible with the generous support of Balranald Shire Council and the Office of Responsible Gambling.

The LifePak CR2 AED is:


- one of the most easy-to-use defibrillators on the market

Community Event of the Year	To be eligible the person/group must have staged an outstanding community event during the calendar year of 2023.	
Special Achievement Award (Any field)	 Outstanding achievement and leadership in the local community. Special recognition to an individual, committee or group who have demonstrated notable or substantial singular or multiple achievements or contributions 	
Sportsperson of the Year	 (30 years or older on 26 January 2024) Outstanding achievement in one or more sporting field(s). Demonstrated commitment, application, dedication and involvement in sporting activities that promote recreation, health and wellbeing of the community. 	
Young Sportsperson of the Year (Under 30 years)	 (Under 30 years of age on 26 January 2024) Outstanding achievement in one or more sporting field(s). A person who has actively supported the sporting community in a voluntary capacity, achieved outstanding results in their sporting field or assisted in promoting sport in their local area. 	
Sporting Team of the Year	 Outstanding team achievement in one or more sporting field(s). Demonstrated commitment, application, dedication and involvement in sporting activities that promote recreation, health and wellbeing of the community. 	

Conditions of entry

All Nominees must be Australian Citizens and residents of Balranald Shire

- Self-nominations will not be accepted.
- Multiple nominations have no bearing on the outcome.
- An individual or group need only one nomination to be considered.
- Nominations must be made on this form.
- The nomination must be signed by the person making the nomination.
- Nomination forms must be received by 5.00pm Thursday 30 November 2023.
- The nominee achievements must be in a volunteer capacity.
- State, Federal or current standing Councillors are ineligible to receive an Australia Day Award.

How nominations will be judged

- The judging panel will make their decisions based on the criteria for each award and the information provided with the nomination forms.
- The panel reserves the right to consider any nomination for any award category.
- The panel's decisions are final and no correspondence will be entered into about their decision.

How to complete a nomination

- Obtain an official nomination form from Balranald Shire Council office or download from Council's Website.
- Legibly print/type your nomination.
- Keep information concise and relevant to meet the conditions of entry.
- Provide supporting information. This should describe the nominee's outstanding service and include examples that best show their achievement and contribution.

Activities undertaken by the person / organisation you are nominating for an Award

Please provide details of how the nominee has made a significant contribution to the community during 2023, including positions held/activities undertaken, and a statement in your own words about why you think the person should be recognised.

As a guide you should cover the following:

- In what role or area has the nominee excelled?
- How has the nominee demonstrated service worthy of recognition?
- How has the nominee's contribution impacted on a particular locality, group or the community at large?
- What makes this person stand out from others?

Award Presentation

- All nominees and nominators will receive an invitation to the Award Ceremony.
- The Administrator and Australia Day Ambassador will present the Awards at the ceremony.
- Award recipients will receive a certificate.
