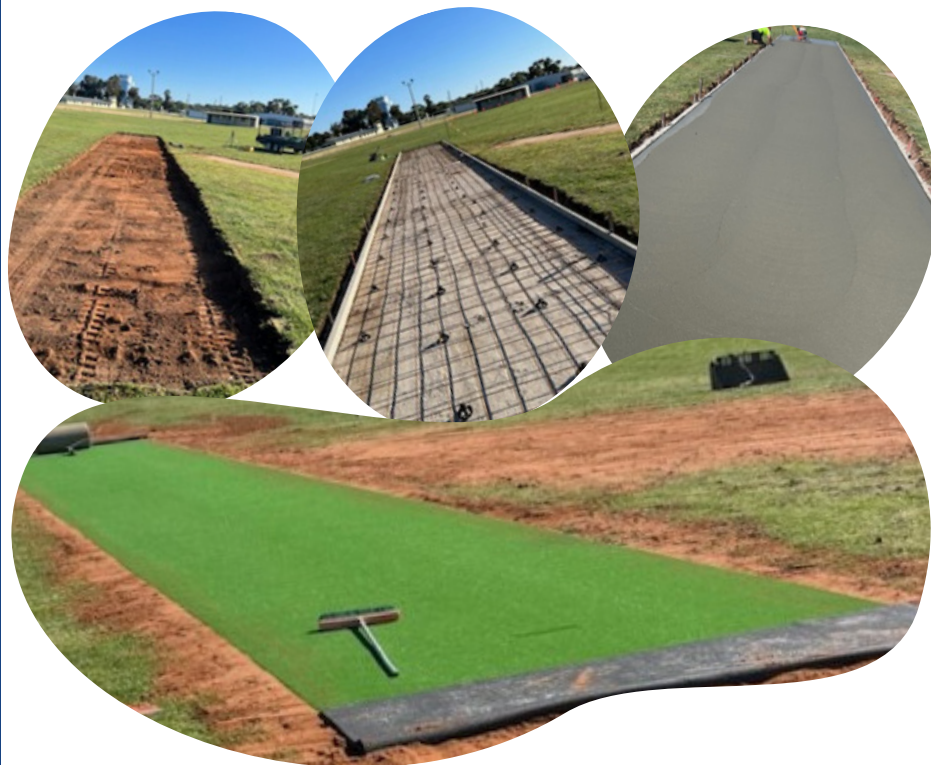
## **HOWZAT!**

## **NEW CRICKET PITCH FOR GREENHAM PARK**

The old cricket pitch at Greenham Park junior oval has been removed. It was narrow, uneven and sunken, and had become dangerous to play on.



The new pitch has been constructed in a slightly different location and angle on the oval, in order to make better use of the available space.



Work is also due to start on the construction of a new practice training net adjacent to the cricket oval.

Both projects have been funded by Local Roads & Community Infrastructure (LRCI) grants.

# Janelle Masters Swimming Pool, Balranald

Council has received grant money to replace the perimeter fence around the swimming pool grounds. The existing fence is not compliant with current legislation.

A contractor has been engaged to supply and install the new fencing in the coming weeks. It is hoped that works will be completed before the pool opens for the summer season.

Council staff have drained and cleaned the pools and are carrying out repair and maintenance works to get everything ready for the opening in late October or early November, depending on the weather.

# NEW REQUIREMENTS

FOR FOOD BUSINESSES FROM 8 DECEMBER 2023

- ✓ cafes
- ✓ restaurants
- ✓ takeaways
- ✓ caterers
- ✓ supermarkets and delis
- ✓ coffee vans
- ✓ childcare services
- ✓ school canteens

Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices.

While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors.

The NSW Food Authority has developed a range of resources to help businesses prepare for the new Standard, including free online food handler training.

Businesses can also do a quick quiz to check if the requirements apply.

# GARBAGE BINS

## PLEASE CLOSE THE LID

Overflowing rubbish bins lead to escaping rubbish and more litter on our streets  
Exposed rubbish attracts scavengers and vermin

**PLEASE DO NOT OVERFILL YOUR BIN - MAKE SURE THAT THE LID IS FULLY CLOSED**

**COUNCIL CAN SUPPLY AN ADDITIONAL BIN FOR YOUR HOME FOR \$300 PER YEAR - THAT'S ONLY \$5.77 PER WEEK**  
(Extra bins put out that do not have the Council logo will NOT be emptied on collection day)

The garbage truck begins collections very early in the morning. If your bin is not put out THE NIGHT BEFORE, you may miss out on your bin being emptied. The truck is fitted with cameras that record each bin it passes.

**The garbage truck will NOT return to empty your bin if it is not put out in time**

Putting old oil, or liquid paint into the garbage can cause:

- Garbage truck fires
- Toxic land pollution
- Spray onto nearby property if the truck compressors burst the container

**PLEASE DO NOT THROW SUMP OIL  
IN YOUR GARBAGE BIN**

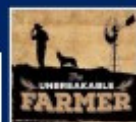
