JACKSON BIALOBRZESKI NAMED DUAL WINNER OF THE 2024 TOM HARVEY AWARD

Jackson Bialobrzeski, 19-year-old from Balranald has this year been named a dual winner of the 2024 Tom Harvey Award, an initiative of the Australian Youth Trust, recognising outstanding contribution of a young Australian citizen between the age of 15-30 years.

At the age of 14, he became Youth Mayor of Balranald Shire Council, a position he held for almost 4 years before leaving to attend university, making many changes, including free entry to the local swimming pool, upgrade to amenities in parks and improved library services, the provision for more family entertainment and festivals for youth.

It remains Jackson's passion to make regional areas like Balranald, more appealing for young people to live their lives, and provide them necessary resources to be able to live, work and study in communities like Balranald.

On completion of his university degree, he aspires to working in local government projects, appreciating you can make a difference.

Jackson was nominated by Member for Murray, Mrs Helen Dalton MP, will be presented with his Award at the Commonwealth Day luncheon in the presence of his mother and Her Excellency, the Honourable Margaret Beazley AC KC Governor of NSW.

Council News

Balranald Shire Council is on the move with 4 major community projects to be delivered by mid-2024.

On Tuesday 20th February 2024 at its Ordinary Council Meeting, Balranald Shire Council accepted tenders for the completion of 4 major community projects.

"To have one tender accepted for a large project at an Ordinary Council Meeting is always a magnificent achievement but to have four passed at one meeting is exceptional" said Mr Glenn Carroll who is Council's newly appointed Director of Governance, Business & Community Services. "This clearly demonstrates the positivity, commitment, determination and focus that Council has in delivering projects across the Shire that align with community needs and objectives.

The four major projects that are about to go into delivery and construction mode include:

Balranald Lions Park Upgrade Project:

This is a \$1million redevelopment of Balranald's Lions Park which is a key rest point for travellers coming from the west of Balranald and also a meeting place for local families. The project's focus is on accessibility and inclusivity. All existing play equipment is to be removed and replaced with a new modern play layout including flying foxes, swings and much more. The park has been designed to accommodate not only the young within our community but provide an inclusive space for community members of all ages as well as attracting visitors to our town. Works are anticipated to commence in early March with completion by June 2024.

Euston Recreation Reserve Football Club – Field Refurbishment:

This much anticipated project is also set to commence towards the end of March and will see the existing football oval be recultivated and provided with an all new irrigation system. Full perimeter fencing will encompass the oval, as well as new field lighting, goal posts, timekeepers box and electronic scoreboard. The \$800k development is set to enable the Euston Football Club to host home games and provide a training ground for football enthusiasts of all ages. The anticipated completion date for the project is July 2024.

Euston Recreation Reserve-Netball Precinct:

Council is excited to announce the refurbishment of the Euston Netball Precinct at the Euston Recreation reserve. Works will include the extension and renovation of the existing netball change rooms and toilet facilities, resurfacing of the netball court and extension of the concrete aprons to the perimeter of the existing netball court. New lighting and shade shelter for the existing netball court will also be provided as part of the project.

Balranald Discovery Centre & Interpretive Pavilion Upgrade:

Works will commence shortly on a \$950k investment in the Discovery Centre tourist precinct. The funding will provide for a new building which will adjoin the Visitor Information Centre and Museum as well as a full upgrade of the technical equipment in the award winning Interpretive Pavilion. All drawing documentation has now been completed and construction works are set to commence by the end of March with a July 2024 completion date. The new building will provide a space for further promotion of the wonderful tourism attractions that Balranald Shire has on offer and help attract more visitors to the region and boost the local and regional visitor economy.

There is a real buzz in the air and exciting times ahead with a new Council to be elected in September, the General Manager, Craig Bennett at the helm, two (2) newly appointed directors along with a designated project manager and staff all working together with the Community in a positive and proactive manner for the provision of excellent amenities in our Balranald Shire Communities.

Council appreciates the NSW and Federal Governments for the funding provided towards these projects.

Kyalite Riverside Reserve

Solar lighting has been installed at the Kyalite Riverfront steps and an information board is to be placed at the car park well above the Flood level. This work is under the control of the local Kyalite Committee. Damage to the boat ramp and the pontoon is currently being assessed by Council staff who will also progress proposed improvements to the Memorial Park area.

Regional Roads

Heavy patching works are ongoing on MR67 (Balranald-Ivanhoe Road) within the Balranald Shire. Stage two of these works commenced in December 2023 and will continue being delivered into 2024, dependent on funding.

Pothole and edge repairs and patching on sealed roads in the Balranald and Euston town areas is continuing.

This work is being funded from the Fixing Local Roads Pothole Repair grant. Pothole repairs are continuing at several other Shire sealed and unsealed roads.


Flood Damaged Roads

Oxley Road (MR514) remains closed due to flood water damage approximately 18 km from the intersection of the Balranald-Ivanhoe Road. Road closed notifications are active on NSW Live Traffic, however there are still vehicles driving through closed road signs and destroying the existing pavement due to floodwater.

Morris Road / Antonio Drive at Euston remains closed due to flood water damage. Repair works were commenced, however due to excessive water within the pavement further works have been postponed until the pavement is completely dry. Road Closed warning signs are in place. Road closed notifications are active on NSW Live Traffic. These works are now completed.

Severe damage to the Abbots Tank Road from Storm and Floodwater has now been repaired.



Mobile Muster

The end of 2023 saw MobileMuster engage in a number of activities to round out the year, from encouraging young Australians to get involved in mobile recycling, to helping wild Gorillas in Africa.

Collections for mobile phones were as forecast and on target. While we did see a slight reduction in our expanded program (modems, smart home and wearables), we expect these numbers to pick up in the new year.

2024 is off to a great start, with a partnership with Planet Ark live in February, and a major brand campaign hitting consumers in March. We're also working closely with our government stakeholders to ensure the continuation of the program in the best possible circumstances.

All this and more below, so read on. We look forward to working with you all in 2024.

MobileMuster partners with Victoria Zoo

In December the MobileMuster Program partnered with Zoos Victoria to increase mobile collections at their four park locations. For every phone recycled at a Victoria Zoos park, customers would receive a voucher for a free coffee, and go into the draw to win an exclusive behind-the-scenes experience with the Gorillas at Melbourne Zoo.

This partnership was developed because components in mobile phones are mined from Gorilla habitats.

MobileMuster gives a rebate to the Zoos for collecting phones, which goes towards helping wild Gorillas in Africa.

Collections had been declining with our Zoo partners, so this incentive scheme was developed to try and boost consumer interest.

Overall the incentive was a success, with an increase of over 150% vs the annual monthly average. The campaign was highlighted on ABC News Victoria radio, and Zoos Victoria encouraged their membership base via their newsletter & social media, all contributing to the boost in numbers. We will be running a similar program with our other Zoo partners in the coming months.
