High Pedestrian Activity Area Balranald HPAA

Transport for NSW has implemented a High Pedestrian Activity Area, with a reduced speed limit of 40km/hr in parts of Market Street, We Street, Mayall Street, River Street and Bank Street in Balranald. The new speed limit came into effect on Monday 24 June 2024, and this change will maintain a constant lower speed environment and improve safety for pedestrians.

The maximum speed limit is 40km/hr at all times.

The different road environment helps to alert drivers to the lower speed limit. This creates a safer road environment for all road users, particularly for pedestrians, cyclists and children.

Why 40km/hr?

Research and scientific analysis show that a pedestrian hit by a car travelling at 40km/hr has twice the chance of surviving the collision than if the car was travelling at 50km/hr.

Travelling speeds higher than 40km/hr greatly increases the risk of injury and death to pedestrians.

INFRASTRUCTURE REPORT

Regional Roads

- Heavy patching works on MR67 (Balranald-Ivanhoe Road) within the Balranald Shire are ongoing; and
- Road damage from heavy vehicles continues to occur. Work continuing with contractor and council staff

patching.

Unsealed Road Maintenance

Regional Emergency Road Repair Fund (RERRF)

Work continues on repairs, reshaping & maintenance grading to flood damaged unsealed roads within the Shire using RERRF funding.

- Prungle Mail Road treated with Polytahr;
- Arumpo Road treated with Polytahr;
- Balranald Weir Road maintenance grading & improvement of drainage on road shoulders;
- Redbank Weir Road maintenance grading & improvement of drainage on road shoulders;
- D Block Road treated with Polytahr;
- Wintong Road treated with Polytahr; and
- Glen Emu Road treated with Polytahr.

Resealing Program

Reseals have been carried out on sections of the following roads:

- Tapalin Mail Road 2 km;
- Marma Box Creek Road 19 km; and
- Weimby Kyalite Road 13.2 km.

Flood Damaged Roads



Oxley Road (MR514) remains closed due to flood water damage approximately 18 km from the intersection of the Balranald-Ivanhoe Road. Road closed notifications are active on NSW Live Traffic, however there are still vehicles driving through closed road signs and destroying the existing pavement due to floodwater. Council is now organising flood funding applications for future restoration works.

Footpath Replacement

Council has received funding for footpath replacement/construction works under round three of the Local Community and Infrastructure (LRCI) program.

In Balranald, replacement works have been carried out on footpaths that are in poor state. These paths have also been widened to allow improved pedestrian, bicycle, wheelchair, gopher and pram access. Works will continue into June.


In Euston, a new concrete footpath is being constructed between the roundabout and the existing riverside walking track. This path will be a total of 500m in length, with an expected completion date of mid-June 2024.

WATER, SEWERAGE AND DRAINAGE

2.1 Sewer Relining

Interflow have completed the sewer relining works for the 2023-2024 Financial Year. Interflow have a two-year contract with Council, and further works will be carried out in the next financial year.






Phone and seatbelt detection cameras will start to detect drivers and passengers who are not properly wearing a seatbet from 1 July 2024. Penalties will apply from 1 July for drivers detected not wearing a seatbelt properly or with a passenger not wearing a seatbelt properly. There won't be a warning letter period.

It has been a requirement in NSW for more than 50 years. Sadly, we continue to see lives being lost and people being seriously injured from not wearing a seatbelt or not wearing it properly.

NSW Police will continue to enforce correct seatbelt use.



The 5 main functions of seatbelts are to:

- allow you to decelerate at the same rate as the vehicle in a crash
- spread the force of the impact over the stronger parts of your body (pelvis and chest area)
- prevent you from colliding with the interior parts of the vehicle
- reduce your risk of being thrown out of the vehicle
- work together with the airbags. In a crash, the seatbelt slows the speed of your body moving forwards, so you impact safely with the airbag.

Balranald Local Government Area Ready for 4G

Telstra will be closing their 3G mobile network on 31st August 2024.

Telstra has informed Council that works to deliver 4G to the Balranald Local Government Area are complete, meaning that the area is now 4G ready.

Residents who could only get 3G on the Telstra network should now be able to enjoy the extra speed and capacity of 4G and will continue to have Telstra mobile coverage after 31st August.

Most mobile devices in Balranald are able to access the 4G network. However, there are still a small number of 3G-only mobile devices accessing the Telstra network that will need to be replaced or upgraded before 31st August if they wish to remain connected.

The easiest way to check if mobile phones will be impacted is to use Telstra free 3G SMS Checker. This tool will show customers who use the Telstra mobile network if their mobile is impacted by the 3G network closure, and if so, any action they need to take.

The SMS checker tests the service number you are texting from. If customers simply text the number '3' to 3498, we'll text you back telling you if you need to take any action.

Please note: This checker only works for people using mobile devices who are Telstra customers or are on another supplier who use the Telstra network. For people using Optus or Vodaphone based networks, they will need to check with their carrier if any action is needed.

Some older 4G mobiles require a 3G network to make calls to Triple Zero, however they use the 4G network for all other calls. This 3G only emergency connectivity is a hardware feature built into the design of the phone by the manufacturer and it is a global, industry-wide issue that many countries have already worked through as they closed their 3G networks.

It is important to note that 3G only devices may not be limited to phones. 3G only Telstra Cel-Fi GO repeaters, 3G only Telstra Mobile Smart Antennas (TMSA) and Internet-of-Things (IoT) or Machine-to-Machine (M2M) devices such as eftpos, telemetry & medical devices may be affected by the closing of the 3G network.

Over recent months Telstra has been contacting customers who they have been able to identify as using one of these devices to let them know they will likely need to upgrade.





Be Fire Safe: Never leave cooking unattended. If a fire in your kitchen becomes unmanageable – get out, stay out and call Triple Zero (000). When fire takes hold every second counts. In less than 30 seconds a small flame can get completely out of control and turn into a major fire. Be fire safe and discuss and practice your home escape plan with your household.



Be Fire Safe: Don't ignore the signs! A damaged or failing Lithium-ion battery can explode, releasing highly toxic fumes. These fires are hard to put out. Never use or charge a damaged battery.
