We are looking for funding for the possibility of a facility for a doctor to practice one day a week in Euston in the foreseeable future.



Infrastructure Update

Here is a small snapshot of the works currently happening in the Infrastructure **Department**

Road Construction and Maintenance

Maintenance grading taking place on Gulthul rd and Benanee Rd.

Asphalt being laid on Kilpatrick drive 500m on northern end and 200m on southern end. 40mmHP to give added strength to pavement as heavy vehicles are tearing the new seal this will eliminate the problem. The high temperatures haven't help the situation.

3.9 km of construction works taking place on Marma Box Ck Rd aiming for completion around April.

Maintenance grading will recommence on the unsealed network as soon as it cools down this will allow grading crews to get a better result as it isn't as hard to get the moisture into the road for compaction.

Slashing will be taking place on MR 67 Ivanhoe Rd using a positrak this will eliminate punctures from the salt bush being slashed. Council attempted to slash with tractor but was unsuccessful due to punctures. Once the bush is knocked down it will be maintained and poisoned etc. Giving drivers better visibility with animals and stock.

Signage is being replaced around council and will be ongoing.


Bidgee Haven Retirement Hostel



Increase your cat's lifespan

Get it desexed



Early desexing of your cat benefits your feline friend, your community and your wallet.

Desexing significantly reduces the risk of serious feline health problems such as uterine infections, mammary cancer and testicular cancer.

Desexed cats roam less, which can:

- reduce their likelihood of getting lost or injured
- reduce their risk of contracting diseases and fighting with other cats
- help protect native wildlife.

Desexing saves you money

All cats must be registered by 12 weeks of age, requiring a one-off payment. If a cat isn't desexed by 4 months of age, the owner must pay an annual permit fee until it is desexed.

The Cat Protection Society of NSW, RSPCA NSW and Animal Welfare League NSW can provide expert advice on desexing, adoption and ways you can help cats in your community.
