From the Mayor's Office

Bidgee Haven Hostel has just recently celebrated its 30th anniversary. Largely built off the back of over \$700,000 worth of local people fundraising and donating money, it is owned and run by Council.

It has run for many years at a deficit. There has been around \$6 million dollars in grant funding which had been given to the former Council to expand and improve the hostel, and this money has been sitting there for years. The elected Council members and the Executive team decided it is time this money was used for the good of the hostel, and to keep its resources at peak.

Under the current grant, the Council will accomplish many valuable implementations and upgrades which will further maintain and enrich Bidgee Haven Hostel.

These include the construction of a new six-bedroom extension, which consists of the expansion by five high-dependency rooms plus a room to replace one lost to the internal modifications of the existing facility.

There will be new kitchen works and new dining room extension to the existing building. Also included are landscaping, fire protection upgrade (pump house and tanks), power upgrade, loose furniture fittings and equipment and an activity room extension.

There will also be laundry and pan room refurbishment and external works and infrastructure including fencing. Additionally, in May, Council will be applying for two grants to continue the Bidgee Haven enhancement project. With grant funding, there will be a rework of store and consulting rooms, as well as a refurbishment of existing resident rooms. The second amount of grant funding will allow the Bidgee Haven staff accommodation project to commence, with the building of two, two-bedroom units, and three studio-like rooms.

At the moment there are rooms at Bidgee Haven which are unoccupied and not bringing in revenue. While we are definitely thinking towards the future with regards to making sure there is enough room for residents, we are also thinking about the whole picture, and the bottom line is you cannot have residents there without qualified staff also having somewhere to live in order to work there as well.

It is vital to be proactive about things and accomplish things now and into the future; the longer things remain the same, the more work needs to be done in the future. A lot needs to be done in the shire, in a lot of areas.

And Council has hit the ground running.

ZONING RESTRICTIONS

The recent community consultation drop-in session was to discuss the housing strategy for the shire. One of the issues raised was to change the zoning restrictions on allocations of land around the area, and the size restrictions of lots.

We are certainly looking towards changing the size restrictions on blocks. At the present time, there is a restriction on blocks to the tune of about 40 hectares, and we are looking to change it so people can have five acre lots for hobby farms and various other purposes, and rezoning land next to town.

The change has already been made in Euston and has been in the processes for four years or more. Euston is an intensive agricultural area, and the move has been to great benefit for many.

THE CENSUS

Council have been urging agencies such as the Australian Bureau of Statistics to find alternate solutions to reporting population in the area. When initiatives such as the community consultations are undertaken it means experts looking into and analysing the needs of the town are operating on inaccurate data when they are looking to the census. The census is not accurate for the area as we have a lot of seasonal and itinerant workers; therefore, many times of the year, populations of towns, such as Euston and Robinvale, can be easily doubled if not tripled.

As fantastic as these workers are for our local economies, for the government at large to not be recognising this means we are accommodating many more people in the area but not receiving the correlating government funding for essential needs such as medical and hospitals.

Figuring out how to get this accurately reflected on things such as the census is still an ongoing issue. The way it is at the moment is actually hurting us, we need to make government bodies understand and reflect the true number.

The census tells us who we are and where we are going as a nation, and helps our communities determine where to build everything from schools to supermarkets, and homes to hospitals. It helps the government decide how to distribute funds and assistance to states and localities.

BALRANALD AIRPORT

Council has resolved to negotiate with the adjacent landowners of the Balranald Airport. This negotiation is to try to purchase land to extend the runway at the Balranald Airport which will potentially add over 500 meters to the existing runway. The primary goal is to upgrade the airport's capabilities and facilitate the use of larger aircraft. The extended runway would improve the airport's ability to attract larger commercial and private aircraft, supporting regional economic development and tourism. Additionally, It will improve the airport's ability to handle larger firefighting aircraft and other emergency services, enhancing community safety.

RIVERINA AND MURRAY JOINT ORGANISATION (RAMJO)

In the interests of being proactive, Balranald Shire Council has been attending RAMJO meetings for the past few months, in an observer capacity and intends on joining the organisation. The RAMJO brings together 11 regional councils to provide a united and local voice for our communities on key issues. The RAMJO region covers an area of over 80,000 square kilometres and has a population of 152,909 people.

Joint organisations help to build stronger councils and to improve service delivery and infrastructure in key priority areas such as water security, energy, transport, digital connectivity, waste management and health, across these rural and regional communities.

The small RAMJO team works collaboratively with the General Managers and Mayors and other staff at each council to identify priority issues and then advocate for government funding and industry support to address these key projects.

CARAVAN PARK

There is the prospect of a Master Plan for Balranald Caravan Park with the view of upgrading and modernising the council asset. This is of course all subject to grant funding. Additionally, it is being considered whether it would be more beneficial for council to keep running the caravan park utilising day labour or for Council to lease the park to another party to manage.

BYPASS

There has been some uncertainty in the community, with talks of a potential bypass being implemented. During the recent community consultation meeting with regard to housing, attendees expressed they were happy with the prospect of the ever-increasing quantity and sized heavy vehicles to have another avenue to travel, but were worried a bypass would result in the town dying, such as other towns like Tooleybuc who have had a bypass. It is my view that this simply would never happen.

As part of an agreement entered into by the Iluka mining company at the start of their work in the area, an upgrade is to be made by them to McCabe Street in Balranald. This was so mining trucks coming in off the Ivanhoe Road had somewhere to go, with the aim of reducing the strain on main roads in the town.

On 6th May I attended the Highway Taskforce Meeting. Some of the discussion with Transport NSW centred around the future transportation of wind turbines via their preferred route from South Australia through our Shire to the destination windfarms. One of the benefits of this increased traffic will be the installation of overtaking lanes on the Sturt Highway between Euston and Balranald, the road upgrade would be funded by the windfarm companies. Any full or future bypass would undergo heavy and specific consultation with the community.

SOUTHERN CROSS MUSEUM

Balranald Shire Council was recently approached to take over the highly popular and culturally significant Southern Cross Museum. At the moment, we still need to be careful and conservative in our actions. Balranald Shire Council is still subject to two Performance Improvement Orders, one implemented in 2019, and one implemented in 2024.

We are making great progress with these, but are still working through them, and need to heed these and be cautious, especially with regard to budgeting.

EXECUTIVE ROLE CHANGES

The Interim General Manager, Mr Peter Bascomb has also recommended and implemented changes to the organisational structure of the executive arm of Balranald Shire Council.

The role of Director of Governance will now be split into two positions; Chief Financial Officer and Executive Manager of Community and Governance. The two more focused positions will only continue to ensure all aspects of the council's needs and business run to peak. The position of Director of Infrastructure and Planning Services will remain.

Mayor Zaffina received his Country Mayoral Association Pin at a dinner held for all Country Mayors in NSW. The Minister for Health, the Hon. Ryan Park, addressed the meeting with some important issues facing rural communities with regard to health workforce shortages. The Minister agreed to meet with the Mayor at a later date to discuss the health issues that are being faced within the shire.



COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENT



April 2025 Council commenced draining then cleaning & disinfecting the Balranald **raw water** reservoir. This activity is in preparation for filtered water Reservoir refurbishment.



This may produce **minor disruptions** to services for commercial end-users such as **water carting** operations. For the duration of approximately **2 months** water carting operations will need to source the **raw water** from an alternative location.



The **raw water** reservoir has been **refilled** for later use to re-charge filtered water reticulation. Restrictions are now in place with raw water usage.



Council **does not envisage any disruption** of filtered water supply to residential or end user.



Using the filtered water from the raw water reservoir,



Council will re-charge the filtered and raw water reticulation.



Council will **decommission** the filtered water reservoir then **drain** the filtered water reservoir ready for mandatory tenderer site inspection briefing.



Filtered water Reservoir refurbishment will commence the second week of **June 2025**



Council anticipates the practical completion of filtered water during **September 2025**

Balranald Shire Council Fresh Start Program

The NSW Government's Fresh Start program is funding the wages of an additional 1,300 apprentices, trainees and cadets in the local government sector over the next six years.

More than 60 per cent of the approved new roles are in regional and rural councils, providing a major boost to regional communities and more job opportunities for people in country towns.








Temporary Closure McCabe Street

On Monday 28th of April 2025 works commenced on the upgrade of Ivanhoe Road / McCabe St Intersection with lane closures, and the closure of McCabe Street, between Market Street and Ivanhoe Road, to widen/upgrade and resurface the road. These works were subjected to an approved State Significant Development SSD 5285 for the Balranald Mineral Sands Mine by Iluka Resources Limited.

As this works program rolls out:

- A detour has been put in place via Market Street and Mayall Street;
- Access will be maintained to Island Road and Baupie Road;
- Oversize vehicles are being directed under escort through McCabe St alignment, as required;
- Access will be maintained to properties and businesses; and
- Access will be maintained to the Aboriginal Cemetery and Motorcycle Track.
