#### From the Mayor's Office Continued

#### **National General Assembly**

The General Manager, Peter Bascomb and myself attended the NGA in Canberra hosted by ALGA.

There were exhibitions with private businesses and Government departments displaying latest technology, one highlight for me was called MY LOT, a software company that can setup council websites, people can go online and type in their lot number and DA proposal, this saves time for the council in the initial stages, if the DA meets the criteria for your specific location.

Peter and I also met up with The Hon. Sussan Ley at parliament with other Mayors and GMs for the Farrer electorate. Many issues were discussed, I think the coalition needs to get its house in order with its policies before we can see the government held accountable.



#### Bidgee Haven Hostel

The Bidgee Haven variation application for expanding the Bidgee Haven Retirement Hostel was successful.

This variation will allow for the construction of memory support rooms, a new kitchen, dining area, and an improved activity area.

Council is still waiting on the outcome of its application for funding the refurbishment of existing rooms and construction of staff accommodation.

#### Fluoridation in Water

On Tuesday 8 July 2025 Council held a workshop on the effects of fluoridation on people's health. There were presentations from June and Ken Spinks and Dr Victor Carey and Jason Harwood.

It was a very interesting meeting both parties had very valid points, although some studies suggest that there is a benefit to the health of teeth, they don't completely rule out that its not causing side effects or links to health problems.

Euston does not have fluoridation in the water as Balranald does, whenever people smile in Euston they seem to have teeth though.

It's a very interesting subject and I feel that we should be discussing it further with the community, especially if Euston is to be considered in fluoridating their water.





The Road pavement widening work taking place near the Hatfield Hotel on MR67 is midway to completion. The southern section of the 3.7km of works will be sealed in July. Pavement works on northern section has commenced.

This section of road will be much safer to use improving transport logistics for heavy vehicles/light commercials and passenger vehicle operation.

#### **Euston Footpath Update**

55m of new concrete shared path has been installed in Euston.

The shared path commences from Luke Road to the Corner of Carey Street and Sturt Highway. The shared path now provides a valuable pedestrian link to Euston CBD.



#### **Balranald Footpath Replacement**

115m of concrete footpath was replaced with a new shared concrete path on the northern side of the Market Street alignment. The 115m of concrete footpath needed replacement due to cracking, uneven surface, and a narrow corridor. The replacement shared concrete path is 1.8m wide to allow safer use for pedestrian's gong to and from the CBD.

The new shared concrete path commences from Yuranigh Street and follows the Market Street alignment toward Moa Street terminating at 115m, the (existing/old) remaining 95m section of concrete footpath connecting to Moa Street will be replaced in July with 1.8m wide new shared concrete path.













110m of Kerb and gutter has been replaced in Church Street Balranald.

The section replaced was retaining water during rain events. The replacement kerb and gutter will be a noticeable improvement allowing stormwater to escape off the road pavement and away from residential properties into Councils piped network.














### BIOSECURITY UPDATE!!

The team have been busy completing tree trimming and weed spraying of Balranald cemetery, and Soady Lane. There has been ongoing African boxthorn control and prickly pear control, with the fortunate finding of some cactoblastis moth larvae found in some prickly pear around the area. This is a great biological control method to help with the control of the cactus by removing the cactus with cactoblastis and placing it with uninfected plants.


