


Acacia

Balranald Fire Station is recruiting soon! If you are over the age of 18 and live and work within a reasonable distance to the Fire Station join the team prepared for anything!

#### What is an On-Call Firefighter?

On-Call Firefighters (OCFF) provide a high standard of emergency response to fires, accidents, rescues, and other incidents - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. While an OCFF is not rostered on full-time, they must declare their availability a week in advance, making it possible to balance primary jobs and family commitments.

An OCFF responds to variety of emergencies i.e. building fires, grass and bushfires, flood emergencies, assist ambulance, car accidents and animal rescue.

When an incident occurs, they receive an alert via a pager and mobile to go straight to the station to respond. The 2024/2025 response rates at Balranald Fire Station were:

- · Calls: 47
- · Calls during business hours Mon-Fri: 22%, approx. 10 calls per year in these hours
- · Average call duration: 1 hour and 37 minutes

#### Benefits to becoming an OCFF

- · Part time job receive a fortnightly retainer and paid an hourly rate when responding to incidents, training, drills and community events.
- · Leave entitlements accrue annual leave, sick leave and long service leave
- · Extensive training in:
- emergency life support
- develop teamwork, leadership and critical thinking skills
- opportunity to upgrade licence to MR
- contribute to the local community through fire safety awareness and promoting fire prevention

#### Benefits to Business

- · Staff are trained in emergency, risk and safety management, emergency life support first aid, dealing with hazardous materials
- · Confident staff who have excellent teamwork and communication skills
- · Daytime availability is a must to respond all hours of the day. We do understand this might be an inconvenience to the employer, however it is not an everyday occurrence

#### How to become an On-Call Firefighter?

- · An OCFF will attend 8 days of face-to-face training
- · Complete 36 hours of online learning modules
- · Commit to attending a drill night once a fortnight to keep their skills current
- · Provide at least 24hrs per week availability to attend incidents and fire calls



Please provide details of how the nominee has made a significant contribution to the community during 2025, including positions held/activities undertaken, and a statement in your own words about why you think the person should be recognised. As a guide you should cover the following:

- In what role or area has the nominee excelled?
- How has the nominee demonstrated service worthy of recognition?
- How has the nominee's contribution impacted on a particular locality, group or the community at large?
- · What makes this person stand out from others?

- All nominees and nominators will receive an invitation to the Award Ceremony.
