From the Mayor's Office

On the 13th of November, CEO Terry Dodds PSM and I attended the Country Mayors Association Annual General Meeting held at NSW Parliament House.

The meeting was very interesting. Hon Chris Minns, Premier of NSW and opposition leader Raymond Speakman addressed the meeting, and many questions were asked from the audience, mainly about the challenges that rural councils are facing in regions.

We had the pleasure to meet with the Governor of NSW, Her Excellency Margaret Beazley at Government House and with Minister Ron Hoenig, who was very pleased to hear how things are going with Balranald Shire.

I also attended the workshop at the George Room Masonic Club to discuss the CMA Annual Survey.

The CMA association has been strongly advocating for more funding for the rural regions from the State and Federal Governments.

Premiere Chris Minns stated that the NSW return on GST is 86 cents in the dollar, while Victoria gets 107 cents in the dollar. He also went on to say that this is unfair, and the CMA should help the NSW Government lobby against this discrepancy.

In my opinion, this was a distraction from Premier Minns from the fact that the percentage of grants is forecast to be reduced from the NSW state Government over the next few years.

The fact is, that rural councils are surviving on the smell of an oily rag and cannot be sustained. Lobbying for the GST discrepancy does not necessarily mean that more money is going to flow to the rural areas.

Federal Assistance Grants were also the topic; this would certainly be welcome if it were raised to 1% from the now 0.51%. This would be great news, but the end result would be the same if state governments see this as an opportunity to reduce their funding.

We were also informed about the new Environmental Planning & Assessment (Planning System Reforms) Bill 2025. We were advised that the Joint Regional Planning Panels would be phased out and 'Local Planning Panels' (LPPs) would be formed in consultation with councils. However, we were to discover that councillors would not be members of the new LPPs. This is of concern to most.

From the Mayor's Office Continued

Council's new Chief Executive Officer, Terry Dodds PSM, commenced on October 27, having relocated from Tenterfield with his wife Fiona. Mr Dodds has hit the ground running, demonstrating a proactive approach and strong focus on establishing a positive workplace culture at the shire.

Council signed Mr Dodds to a five-year contract, hoping to break the cycle of frequent general managers in the past. The decision to appoint an interim manager for 10 months allowed council adequate time to find the right candidate. I am confident about the shire's direction 12 months after emerging from administration and performance improvement orders. The Office of Local Government has provided very positive reports about Council's progress.



Negotiations continue regarding the purchase of land for extending the runway at Balranald Airport.

Dr Vitalis has announced plans to expand his medical practice in the region and is eagerly awaiting the completion of the medical room in Euston. He currently attends a couple of days a week and is looking to bring additional services to the town.

Works on the Balranald Water Towers have been completed, although the project experienced setbacks, council is pleased to have finished the essential upgrade.

Top dressing of the Euston oval has been completed, the heat in the coming months will be ideal to achieve growth in the lawn which will look amazing, great job to all those involved in this project.

The Discovery Centre Extension is nearing it's final stages, mural designs on walls are being worked on to showcase our wonderful shire and what it has to offer. We are planning on having an opening for the Discovery Centre and the Lion's Park upgrade in the new year.

The Balranald shared footpath newly proposed route along the highway to Endeavour Drive is being worked on with further updates coming soon for the community.

Council has also resolved to seek funding for a proposed shared footpath from the Euston Primary School along the highway to the Recreation Reserve entrance. This will be of great benefit for children to safely ride their bikes or walk to the recreation ground.

Garreffa Parade median strip is complete, works were undertaken to install irrigation and sow lawn, looks great.

Iluka community partnership panel meeting took place on 20 November, the community and scholarship applications were all closely looked at, the result will be announced at a later date. Thank you Iluka for the wonderful support to our communities in the Balranald Shire!

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE!



Island Road Maintenance

Island Road has undergone headworks related to the recent flood event, where pipes had separated and provided egress/moisture into the road pavement, creating a sinkhole.

The new installation of the culvert and headwalls will eliminate this problem from recurring.











Wooranbarra Coorong Road Maintenance

Re-sheeting with natural based material has been added to 4kms of Wooranbarra Coorong Rd alignment, the section mentioned has been raised between 300mm to 450mm. This will make the road accessible during flooding events, also, the road was widened for safety purposes.

The section raised was inaccessible during inclement weather events and will assist local commuters by reducing the incidents of isolation during these events.

Unmetered Water Theft - Important Notice

Balranald Shire Council is committed to ensuring the fair and sustainable management of our community's water resources. As part of this commitment, Council is conducting a follow-up program regarding unmetered water use across the Balranald and Euston townsites.

This initiative supports accurate water usage recording, responsible consumption, and fairness in billing and cost recovery.

Council reminds all residents and property owners that, as the designated water service provider, we are responsible for ensuring the lawful and equitable use of the Shire's water supply.

Unmetered water use occurs when water is accessed without an operational meter or without Council approval. Please note that this is considered unauthorised use and may be treated as water theft under relevant legislation.

Unauthorised water use places an unfair burden on the community, compromises the integrity of Council's water management systems, and can result in increased costs for other ratepayers. Council is taking the matter seriously and will be resolving any identified issues.

LiveBetter set to take on operations of the Balranald Early Learning Centre

LiveBetter Community Services has announced it is working towards taking on the operations of the Balranald Early Learning Centre from 1 January 2026, pending the completion of the required regulatory and approval processes.

The announcement was made at a Balranald Shire Council's Civic Reception on Wednesday, 22 October, recognising the efforts of visiting service agencies to the region to improve the lives of residents across the Balranald Shire. This included celebrating the dedicated work of the local parent-led committee for early childhood education in the community and welcoming a new chapter under LiveBetter.

Following the loss of key staff in August this year, the Centre was at risk of closure. Council stepped in to support the Centre to keep the doors open 3 days per week, by providing Council's Librarian to take on the role of nominated supervisor. To support the Committee and LiveBetter to work towards the transition, Council will continue to provide these services until the end of the year.

"Council is delighted to see LiveBetter stepping into this important role," said Balranald Shire Mayor Louie Zaffina. "The Early Learning Centre has always been a cornerstone of our community, and LiveBetter's commitment ensures that local families will continue to have access to quality early education delivered by dedicated local educators. This partnership represents a positive step forward for Balranald."

This transition marks a significant milestone for Balranald, helping to secure the long-term sustainability of the Centre and continuing access to high-quality early learning for local families. LiveBetter, which also operates the neighbouring Euston Preschool, brings a wealth of experience in early childhood education and community services across regional New South Wales, Victoria, and Queensland.

"We're honoured to build on the incredible legacy established by the Balranald Early Learning Centre committee," said Jenny Nalder, Head of Childhood Education and Development, LiveBetter. "Their passion and dedication have created a service that is truly valued by local families. Our focus is on ensuring the Centre remains strong, sustainable, and continues to nurture children's learning and development for generations to come."

The parent-led committee made the decision to transition the service to LiveBetter to strengthen governance and operational support, ensuring the Centre's long-term viability. Under LiveBetter's banner, it is hoped the Centre will be able to attract the appropriate staffing and resources so the Centre. Subject to recruitment of key staff, it is hoped the centre can go back to operating 5 days per week from 1 January 2026.

"Our committee is proud of the role we've played in supporting early education in Balranald," said Tegan Stevens, out-going President of the Balranald Early Learning Committee. "We're confident that LiveBetter's experience and resources will help the Centre continue to thrive as an essential part of our community."

Families can expect continuity of care, with existing staff remaining in their roles and day □to-day operations continuing without disruption. LiveBetter's existing connection with the Euston Preschool is expected to create new opportunities for collaboration and shared learning between the two services.

"With the support of Council, the committee, and local families, we're working together to ensure a smooth and positive transition," added Jenny Nalder, LiveBetter. "This collaboration shows the power of community partnerships in strengthening the future of rural services."




