BALRANALD SHIRE COUNCIL WINS PRESTIGIOUS COUNCIL CROWN LAND MANAGEMENT EXCELLENCE AWARD



Balranald Shire Council has been named the winner of the Council Crown Land Management Excellence Award at the 2025 Community Achievement Awards for New South Wales and the ACT, recognising the Shire's outstanding work in transforming the Balranald Discovery Centre precinct.

The Community Achievement Awards started in 2002 and are designed to encourage, acknowledge and reward the valuable contributions that individuals, communities and businesses make throughout NSW & The ACT. These awards aim to recognise their success and achievements, which contribute to making NSW & The ACT a better place.

"I'm proud to announce that Balranald Shire Council has won this prestigious award from a very strong field of nominees," said Mayor Louie Zaffina. "With hundreds of nominations received across all categories, this is a tremendous achievement and a wonderful recognition of the dedication, vision and hard work of everyone who has contributed to this project over many vears."

The winners were announced at the Gala Presentation Dinner held at the Shangri-La Sydney on Saturday, 29 November 2025, hosted by 7NEWS Presenter Michael Usher. More than 350 guests from across NSW and the ACT attended the event, including The Hon Stephen Kamper MP, Minister for Lands and Property.

Balranald Shire Council was recognised for its transformation of the Heritage Park Reserve into the Balranald Discovery Centre precinct, now a thriving destination for tourism, learning, and community connection. Key upgrades included a technology refurbishment of the Interpretive Pavilion, introducing interactive storytelling and touchscreen displays celebrating local history and Aboriginal heritage, along with the construction of the Discovery Pavilion, providing a flexible space for exhibitions, workshops and cultural events.

The precinct now features a visitor centre, museum and café, offering a vibrant and engaging experience for both locals and visitors. By blending modern infrastructure with rich heritage, the project supports cultural celebration, community connection and long-term regional economic

sustainability.







The NBN Fibre Upgrade Program is coming to Balranald



Works are scheduled to commence on or around Wednesday 24 December 2025 and are expected to be completed by Tuesday 23 June 2026.

Please be aware that NBN contractors may be working in your street during this period.

We kindly ask that you remain alert to their presence and exercise caution when

driving or moving around the area.

Set out below are details of the likely impact of the activities on your land and the measures which **nbn** (or its contractors) proposes to minimise disturbance to your land and to restore it after completion of the activities.

ANTICIPATED EFFECT:

- Temporary occupation of road reserve areas by small work crews.
- Minimal disruption to pedestrian traffic is anticipated.
- Minimal disruption to vehicular traffic is anticipated.
- Minimal disturbance is anticipated.
- Minor vegetation clearance such as grass removal and tree branch trimming.
- Minor hand excavation of grassed areas to expose pit/manhole lids
- Activity to be confined to footways & established telecommunication alignments.
- No material effects expected resulting from proposed activities.

Breakout and re-instatement of footpaths and road reserves may be required.

PROPOSED REMEDIATION:

- After installation all areas to be filled graded and land surfaces levelled to a condition similar to its condition before the activity began.
- Traffic and pedestrian management procedures will be implemented where required.
- Notify directly impacted property owners.
- Details of remediation (if any) will be communicated to the relevant authority through consultation.
- Standard environmental management techniques would be undertaken.

Draft Balranald Shire Destination Management Plan 2026-2031

The Balranald Shire Destination Management Plan (DMP) provides a strategic framework to guide the sustainable growth, development and promotion of Balranald Shire's visitor economy. It aligns with the NSW Government's Visitor Economy Strategy 2030, Destination NSW regional priorities, Council's Economic Development Strategy and Community Strategic Plan, while reflecting the community's vision for economic resilience, cultural celebration, and environmental stewardship.

The plan outlines a coordinated approach to tourism development that reflects the Shire's unique identity—where ancient landscapes, vibrant wetlands, riverscapes and rich cultural heritage converge. This plan is informed by extensive stakeholder engagement, market analysis, and place-based insights. It integrates tourism with broader community development goals, ensuring that growth in visitation delivers tangible benefits to residents, businesses, Traditional Owners, and the environment.

Draft Balranald Shire Economic Development Strategy 2025-2035

The vision of the plan is to stabilise, consolidate and ultimately grow the community's future by: building prosperity, encouraging enterprise and promoting liveability. In doing so the plan values inclusion, equity and fairness; communication/engagement; integrity and honesty; transparency' trust and respect; and relationship building, collaboration and partnership.

Draft Balranald Shire Council Urban Tree Management Plan 2025-2029

A review of the 2020-2024 UTMP was carried out, and it has been updated to include historical tree registers for Balranald & Euston Townsites, Tree Hazard Evaluation Form, Council Approved and Preferred Trees table and an Essential Energy list of unsuitable trees for planting around Essential Energy assets.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE!

Hatfield The Vale Road

Maintenance grading to smooth the surface.

Improved drainage along the network, which protects pavement and extends the road's life.

MR 67 Balranald-Ivanhoe Road

Installation of new pipes along the shoulders.

Designed to prevent water from pooling near the road edges, helping to prevent moisture penetration of the road shoulder.

These works are all about long-term resilience: keeping roads safer, resource efficiency thus allowing redispersion of maintenance monies to other assets, and ensuring reliable access for residents, freight, and emergency services.

Project Update: MR67 Balranald-Ivanhoe Road

Location: 3 km north of Homebush

Scope of Works: Road widening over a 16 km section (8km of road length)

Progress: 3 km completed to date (On Eastern lane)

Quality Checks:

Compaction testing successfully passed


Final trimming underway before primer sealing

Next Steps: Primer sealing of the completed section will take place in coming weeks followed by continuation of widening works along the remaining 13 km.



This will improve safety for all road users, enhance usability for heavy transport vehicles, and strengthen regional connectivity and freight efficiency.

2025 has seen many new faces visit our Library Hub, with growing programs and daily support we hope to continue this success into 2026


