From the Mayor's Office

Over recent months, nearly every agriculture sector in our Shire has been significantly impacted by adverse weather conditions. Our dryland farmers have endured one of the most severe droughts since the millennium drought, resulting in poor wheat crops and a major shortage of livestock feed. Many farmers have been forced to transport stock to alternative locations, and government intervention through drought relief and support programs has been essential.

More recently, high rainfall has brought a different set of challenges. Flooding has caused substantial damage across several industries, particularly wine grapes, table grapes, and almonds. Growers are strongly encouraged to monitor government announcements for flood-related subsidies, grants, and recovery assistance, as well as ongoing drought relief programs. Support is available, and producers are encouraged to take advantage of any assistance that can help with recovery and future resilience.

I also had the pleasure of visiting Euston Public School, where I was given a tour by Amanda Healy, Anna Kilpatrick, and Jessica Hocking. The Euston Public School Community Hub provides a welcoming and supportive space for local families. It operates through a partnership between Our Place innovative, and the NSW Department of Education Euston Public School Playgroup Program.

The hub is led collaboratively by Amanda Healy, Community Facilitator, and Anna Kilpatrick, Playgroup Coordinator, who work together to support families, strengthen school connections, and improve outcomes for children. Its purpose is to bring together early learning opportunities, family engagement, and access to services in one inclusive environment.

Families have also been supported through referrals and connections to services, the diversity reflects the inclusive nature of the playgroup and its role in supporting multicultural community connections.

The work has been made possible through the ongoing support and collaboration of Troy Westcott, school principal, whose leadership and commitment to community engagement has helped foster a welcoming and inclusive environment.

The hub focuses on supporting children's development, helping families navigate services, reducing barriers to education and employment, and building strong community connections. Activities include a regular

playgroup program that supports early learning through play, assistance with smooth transitions into preschool and school, and service navigation such as warm referrals and hosting visiting services.

Families also receive practical support, including help with enrolment forms, online applications, and basic technology use. The hub additionally provides employment support such as resumes, job applications, and mock interviews. It encourages family engagement with the school and supports the school breakfast club to ensure students start the day positively.

Overall, the Community Hub plays a vital role in strengthening relationships between families, the school, and local services, creating a connected and supportive environment where children and families can thrive.

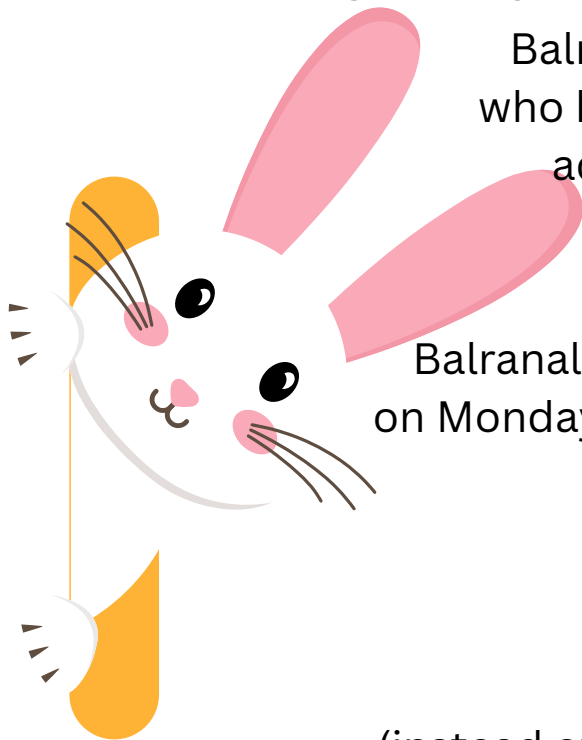

In February, Balranald Shire Council's Engineering & Planning Team delivered key maintenance works and progressed several important infrastructure projects across the region.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE!

Biosecurity

February has been a particularly busy month for Biosecurity operations, with a strong focus on invasive weed control, inspections, and collaboration with landholders and regional partners.

Weed Control Activities

- Prickly Pear Removal: Ongoing removal works continued in the area between Sturt Highway and Duryea Street.
- African Boxthorn Control: Targeted treatments carried out across multiple sites.
- Devil's Rope Cactus: A significant infestation was located, and work is underway with the landholder to develop and implement an eradication strategy.
- Wheel Cactus Findings: Several plants were discovered during recent property inspections; these were removed, and biological control agents were introduced where appropriate.
- Bunny Ear Cactus: Working with Council on a coordinated strategy to remove a small, emerging infestation.

Biological Control Activities

- Continued monitoring of bio-infected cactus populations.
- Redistribution of infected material to healthy cactus stands to encourage spread of the biocontrol agent and assist with long-term suppression.

Pest Control

- Ant Infestations: Responded to and treated multiple ant issue reports across the region.

Water Weed Inspections

Priority waterway and access-point inspections were completed at:

- Boat ramps: Balranald, Euston/Robinvale, Boundary Bend, and Kyalite
- Additional sites: Yanga Creek, Oxley Bridge, and Corrong Bridge

These inspections focused on preventing the spread of aquatic weeds and ensuring early detection of any new threats.



Harben Street Kerb and Gutter works

Works have commenced between Cally and We Street. The southern side will be focused on this financial year, and if funding is available, the northern side will be completed next financial year.



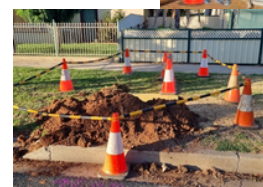
Emergency Services

Early February, Emergency Services were activated and responded to a livestock transporter fire on the Balranald Ivanhoe Road, blocking vehicle access in both directions. The vehicle operator escaped with burn injuries, with the additional loss of 4 cattle. Council Officers were deployed to provide on-scene traffic management while recovery crews cleaned up the site.

NBN Roll Out Balranald

The National Broadband Network (NBN) is continuing its staged rollout across Australia and now Balranald, with ongoing preparation works occurring in many regional communities. As part of these early works, NBN contractors have undertaken activities such as site surveys, pit and pipe assessments, and the installation or upgrade of underground conduit infrastructure.

These works form part of the broader national program to ready Road reserves and service corridors for future connection to fixed line, fixed-wireless, or satellite NBN technologies. Such preparatory activity is common during the "build preparation" phase of the rollout, which involves getting underground pathways and supporting infrastructure ready before construction progresses to the installation of fibre, fixed-wireless equipment, or other NBN technologies.

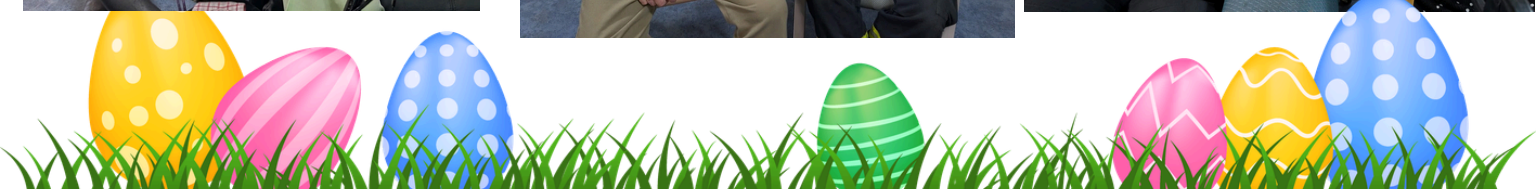
Afternoon Entertainment with Our Wonderful Visiting Firefighters.

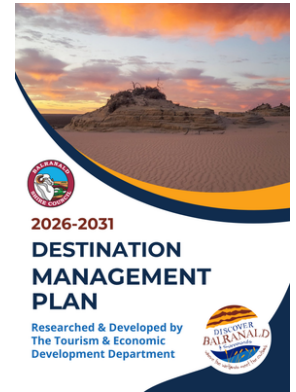

Destination Management Plan 2026-2031

After a series of community workshops and extensive market research during 2025, a draft of the Destination Management Plan (DMP) was submitted to Council in December 2025 and was on public exhibition for 28 days. The DMP is Council's tourism and visitor economy strategic plan for the next 5 years and now that it has been endorsed by Council, actions are underway to begin the delivery process. 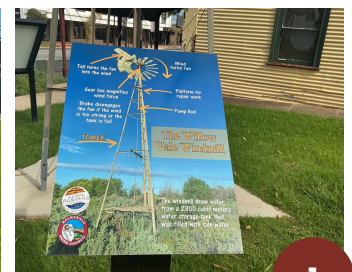
Soft Opening of the Discovery Pavilion

We will have a soft opening of the newly built Discovery Pavilion on the 1st of April to take advantage of Easter visitors and planned Easter Activities. The planned internal displays and furnishings are a work in progress subject to grant funding. A series of wall banners promoting the shire's key attractions are currently in planning mode and will be funded by a recently successful grant submission. An official opening of the Discovery Pavilion will be planned once all internal works are completed.

Soft Opening of the Discovery Pavilion

Recently we replaced the damaged Mungo Man/Alice Kelly sign at the Discovery Centre precinct. The new sign is located at the entrance of the Interpretive Pavilion a perfect introduction the shire's integral cultural connection to the World Heritage Listed Willandra Lakes region, Mungo Man, and Alice Kelly. It was a very special moment for Alice Kelly's family when the upgraded sign was installed.

Late last year we installed the Willow Vale Windmill which was donated by the Hawkins family and lovingly restored by local handyman, Errol Bradbury. Two interpretive signs have also been installed providing the history of the windmill as well as an illustration on the components and workings of the windmill.
